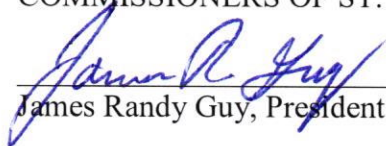
Dear Chairman Morgan,

MD Code, Education, § 16-610

§ 16-610. Reporting and budget requirements

**In general**

(a) Each year the Board of Trustees and the president of the College shall prepare and submit to the county commissioners:

- (1) An annual report;
- (2) An operating budget;
- (3) A capital budget; and
- (4) If required, a long-term capital improvement program.

**Operating budget requirements**

(b) The operating budget shall show:

- (1) All revenues estimated for the next fiscal year classified by funds and sources of income;
- (2) All expenditures requested, including the major functions listed under § 16-304(b) of this title ; and
- (3) Any other information or supporting data required by the county commissioners.

**Review and approval by county commissioners**

(c)(1) The county commissioners in each county shall review and approve the budget allocation request to its county and may reduce it of College.

~~(2) Except as provided in (3) of this subsection Each county's total fiscal year operating fund appropriation to the budget of the College shall meet the requirements of §§16-305 in this title; and each County's contribution the College shall not be less than the amount appropriated for the prior fiscal year, minus non-recurring expenses as referenced in Section 16-305 of this title, of 2020.~~

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~~(3) The budget allocation of the county or counties supporting the College may be reduced below the amount of the adjusted appropriation for fiscal year 2020 in the case of extreme financial distress in the county or counties supporting the college.~~

~~(4) There may shall be a Memorandum of Understanding, as may be amended from time to time, by and between the College and the counties supporting it, addressing the methodology for equitable funding by each of the three counties of college requests for operational and minor capital expenditure increases, and the circumstances under which county funding may be reduced below the amount calculated in subsection (2) of this paragraph, outlining specific operational and capital considerations in determining the budget methodology used to arrive at the counties contribution amount.~~

(5) ~~(4)~~ The methodology for determining budget shall be reviewed every four (4) years by the College and each county.

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**Submission of operating budget for informational purposes**

(d) The operating budget of the College as outlined in this section shall be submitted to the Commission for informational purposes.

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
