Ms. Cudmore presented the proposed FY2017 Recommended Budget for approval to take to Public Hearing at Tuesday, April 19, 2016, at 6:30 pm at Chopticon High School. Included in the \$219,782,337 proposed budget is \$50,772,429 for County Departments (non-profits included in County Departments); \$42,408,042 for Elected Officials; \$113,713,420 for Boards and State Agencies; \$14,763,262 for other budget costs; and, (\$1,874,816) to transfers and reserves. The Public Hearing reserve is \$198,176. The proposed recommended budget also includes the Real Property Tax Rate at \$0.8523, an increase in the Emergency Services Support Tax from \$.016 to \$.028 on each \$100 of assessable and personal property; and, an increase in the Solid Waste Environmental Fee from \$60 to \$72 per year on each improved residential property.

I move that we approve the FY2017 Recommended Budget, as presented, to take to public hearing on Tuesday, April 19, 2016, and that we execute the "Recommended Estimate of Revenues and Appropriations".

A. COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR - Behavioral Health Services Administration Report

Commissioner President Guy opened the public hearing at 6:33 pm.

Notice of this public hearing was published in the *Enterprise Newspaper* on March 23 and 25, 2016. In April 2015, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) suggested that the County consider transferring behavioral health services administration from the St. Mary's County Department of Aging and Human Services to the St. Mary's County Health Department since other jurisdictions support this model and the vendor(s) would receive payments more timely. Dr. Bridgett provided background information on services in the County and noted that meetings were held with stakeholders, information was gathered from Charles and Calvert Counties and technical assistance was provided by DHMH to address the proposed transfer.

Dr. Meenakshi Brewster, Health Officer, St. Mary's County Health Department clarified that although the Health Department has a State Human Resources structure, their mission is completely local. She noted that the Commissioners of St. Mary's County serve as the Board of Health which provides governance for the organization and the Health Department's focus is St. Mary's County and all health issues in the County. As the Health Officer and Health Department we will do whatever the Commissioners desire.

Commissioner Morgan noted that there was a lot of money moving from Grant Funded to Fee for Service. He asked what the impact would be on the County, how this will affect citizens, what is the cause and effect, and how will the move impact the Department of Aging and Human Services?
