A. DEPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS & TRANSPORTATION - Airport Road Donation to State Highway Administration

Mr. Erichsen presented the Notice of Public Hearing published in *The Enterprise Newspaper* on March 18 and 25, 2016 and an Affidavit of Public Hearing Postings. The State Highway Administration (SHA) is requiring that the right-of-way at the intersection of MD Route 235/Airport Drive remain under SHA ownership since it falls within the truncated area of the intersection. The donation plat, as approved by SHA, is consistent with all major intersections throughout the State of Maryland.

Commissioner Guy opened the public hearing for public comments. There were no individuals wishing to speak so Commissioner Guy noted that the record would remain open for public comment for an additional seven days and closed the public hearing at 10:08 am.
