4. PRESENTATION

A. ST. MARY'S COUNTY METROPOLITAN COMMISSION - Presentation of FY2018 Capital Improvement Budget and FY2019 - 2023 Capital Improvement Plan

Present: George Erichsen, Executive Director Rebecca Shick, Chief Financial Officer Christy Hollander, P.E., Acting Chief Engineer Steve Engleson, Grants Administrator

Mr. Erichsen provided an overview of the Metropolitan Commission's Capital Improvement Budget noting changes made with respect to project timing in an effort to provide a more realistic schedule, allow progress to be made on the backlog of existing projects, and to lower and level off MetCom' s outstanding debt and proposed future debt. As a result, the FY 2018 CIB is less than the FY 2017 approved plan for FY 2018 by \$5,873,667 for Water Projects and \$5,983,625 for Sewer Projects and planned debt as a percentage of assessed value is below 1 % for the period of FY 2017-FY 2023. He noted that from FY 2019 - FY 2023 the anticipated Capital Contribution Charges per EDU should remain either level for water or reduced for sewer.

A. ST. MARY'S COUNTY METROPOLITAN COMMISSION - Resolution Authorizing the Borrowing of Drinking Water Bonds from Maryland Department of the Environment

The St. Mary's County Metropolitan Commission is requesting approval to borrow of Drinking Water Bonds from the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). The MDE Water Quality Finance Administration, Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund provides twenty year loans and the current rate is 1.7%.

I move to approve the Resolution authorizing the loan with Maryland Department of the Environment for the Piney Point Water System Project and the St. Clements Shores Water System Replacement Project in the maximum principal amount, not to exceed \$2,665,000 and \$5,498,000 respectively; and authorize Commissioner President to execute all related documents.

Mr. Kelly noted a public hearing was held on March 14, 2017. Three citizens provided comments at the hearing and 1 comment was received during the 7 day open comment period. On July 26 the CSMC requested that the agreement be further negotiated to include three additional items: 1) Channel 98 - Hi-Def, 2) Cable Plant Expansion cost sharing provision, and 3) a Senior Citizen Discount. Metrocast did not agree to a Senior Citizen Discount.

I move to authorize the extension of the existing Metrocast Cable Franchise Agreement for 10 years and approve the budget amendment for a \$15,000 grant award for equipment upgrades for Channel 95, and authorize the Commissioner President to execute related documents.

10. PUBLIC HEARING - FY2018 RECOMMENDED BUDGET AND 65-10 SENIOR PROPERTY TAX CREDIT

Dr. Bridgett opened the FY2018 Recommended Budget and 65-10 Senior Property Tax Credit Public Hearings in the Leonardtown High School Auditorium at 6:30 pm. Following introductions of honored guests, Dr. Bridgett introduced Commissioner President Guy who introduced the other Commissioners and provided welcoming remarks.

Ms. Cudmore presented an overview of the \$220,000,000 FY18 Recommended Budget highlighting Revenue Sources and General Fund Expenditures. The budget includes a Constant Yield Rate at \$.08478 per \$100 of assessed value; a reduction of property taxes of \$14. Also, included in the Budget is a proposed Senior Property Tax Credit for seniors. Funding for the Board of Education is \$102.2 million and the Sheriff's Office \$38.5 million. Funding for County Departments is \$45.0 million. County funding includes 34 planned vehicle replacements, a Radio Systems Manager in Emergency Services & Technology, 1 Merit Increase on the anniversary date for Regular and Regular Part Time employees and a 0% Health Insurance rate increase.

Public Information Officer Tony Jones moderated the following 2 public hearings.

PUBLIC HEARING - PROPOSED ORDINANCE TO GRANT A PROPERTY TAX CREDIT TO CERTAIN ELDERLY INDIVIDUALS AND VETERANS

Mr. Jones opened the Public Hearing at 6:50 pm.

The proposed ordinance would grant a property tax credit against the county property tax imposed on the dwelling of (i) an individual who is at least 65 years old and has lived in the same dwelling for at least the preceding 40 years; or (ii) an individual who is at least 65 years old and is a retired member of the armed forces of the United States.

Mr. Jones opened the public hearing up for public comment.
