7. PUBLIC HEARING - FY2017 RECOMMENDED BUDGET, Chopticon High School, 25390 Colton Point Rd., Morganza, MD

Commissioner President Guy welcomed citizens and provided opening remarks. Ms. Cudmore presented an overview of the \$219,782,337 FY17 Recommended Budget. The County's

Property tax rate structure will remain at \$.8523, although the State calculations indicate the Constant Yield Tax Rate for FY17 would be \$.8468. The County's income tax rate will remain at 3%. The allocation for the Sheriff's Office's non-grant activities increased by .5%. The allocation includes implementing the compensation study raising law scale by 9.8% and corrections by 7%. The funding for the Board of Education includes \$96,026,941 for Maintenance of Effort; \$3,690.460 for cost of merit increase provided in FY2016 and required health insurance increase; and \$2,972,992 for non-recurring technology and science textbooks for a total of \$102,690,393. The County funding for elections increased by \$130,174, primarily due to maintenance for new voting machines and replacement equipment. Funding for County department based activities and programs, excluding grants and one-time items, increased by 5.4%, primarily because non-profits agencies were moved under the departments of Aging & Human Services, Economic Development and Recreation & Parks for FY2017. County employees will get a one-step merit increase on their anniversary date. The June 30, 2015 audit reflects an unassigned balance of \$16.6 million that is not being used because of the importance of maintaining a healthy fund balance to help the County weather negative revenue results and avoid sudden disruption or elimination of services. A Public Hearing Reserve of \$198,176 will be reallocated after the Public Hearing based on public and written comments.

Public Information Officer Tony Jones moderated the following 4 public hearings.

PUBLIC HEARING - EMERGENCY SERVICES SUPPORT TAX

The current Emergency Services Support Tax is \$0.016 and is proposed to increase to \$0.028. The average property owner will see an increase of \$34 annually.

Mr. Jones opened the public hearing for public comments at 7:03 pm.

Charles Shilling, P.O. Box #36, Piney Point, MD 20674

Represented St. Mary's County Tax Payers United. Oppose increase.

There were no others wishing to speak so the hearing closed at 7:09 pm.

PUBLIC HEARING - SOLID WASTE & RECYCLING FEE

The solid waste and recycling fee, which covers direct operating cost and related fees, is collected yearly through Property Tax bills. The proposed rate increase from \$60 to \$72 is an increase per property of \$12 annually.

Mr. Jones opened the public hearing public comments at 7:10 pm.

There were no individuals wishing to speak so the hearing closed at 7:11 pm.

PUBLIC HEARING - CONSTANT YIELD TAX RATE

The recommended FY17 budget does not adjust the real property tax rate of \$0.8523 per \$100 assessed value to the current constant yield rate of \$0.8468. Decreasing this tax would decrease revenues by \$646,521.
