A. DEPARTMENT OF LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT - Public Hearing -Proposed Amendment to Ordinance No. 2017-15 to Provide an Exemption to the Impact Fee Ordinance for Replacement Dwelling Units under Certain Conditions

Notice of public hearing was posted in *The Enterprise Newspaper* on April 29, 2018 and May 4, 2018. The proposed amendment has three situations where impact fees are not required to be paid: for the issuance of a building permit to replace, renovate, alter or enlarge an existing or previously existing dwelling unit for which a development impact fee was previously paid; for the issuance of a building permit to replace, renovate, alter or enlarge an existing dwelling unit which was built before May 31, 1974; and for the issuance of a building permit to replace, renovate, alter or enlarge a previously existing dwelling unit which was lost to fire, accident or natural disaster within the last three years.

Commissioner Guy opened the public hearing for public comments. There were no citizens wishing to speak. Commissioner Guy closed the public hearing for public comment noting that the record would remain open for public comment for an additional seven days, and closed the public hearing at 11:14 a.m.
