A. DEPT. OF AGING & HUMAN SERVICES - Decision following Public Hearing for the Community Development Block Grant Funding-Three Oaks Project

A second public hearing was held on June 14, 2016, to receive public input on the Three Oaks Community Development Grant (CDBG) project. The funding will expand services for the Wrapping Arms Round Many (WARM) program. The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development has committed the grant in the amount of \$140,000 to cover the purchase of the modular unit, utility hook-ups and the installation of fire suppression apparatus in the modular unit which will house a Veterans Resource Center and have six crisis beds available for homeless individuals with the most challenging situations. No public comments were received at the hearing or during the seven day open comment period.
