Notice of Public Hearing was published in the Enterprise Newspaper on October 2 and 9, 2015. The property was posted and registered letters were sent to property owners in the area. The property lies within the Charlotte Hall Town Center. The property owner, St. Anne's Anglican Catholic Church, wants to build a Parish Hall on the property. The proposed amendment will change the water service category from W-6D (service in 6 to 10 years, developer financed) to W-3D (service in 3 to 5 years, developer financed). The proposed development would require the allocation of one EDU. The Planning Commission is recommending approval of the proposed amendment.

Commissioner Guy opened the meeting for public comment. There were no public comments. Commissioner Guy stated the record would be left open for 10 days to receive public comments on this matter and closed the public hearing at 10:09 am.

6. MAIN AGENDA ACTIOIN ITEM #2

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR - Non-Profit Funding Policy

Present: Rebecca Bolton Bridgett, Ed.D., County Administrator

Dr. Bridgett introduced the draft non-profit funding policy for FY 2017. She noted the Commissioners asked staff to work with the Vital Community Connectors (VCC) to develop a policy for funding non-profit agencies in the FY 2017 budget year. Dr. Bridgett and Jeannette Cudmore, Chief Financial Officer, met with the leadership of the VCC and the Non-profit Institute at College of Southern Maryland to review the draft policy and seek their input. The County will be using Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) software this year during the annual budget process. Dr. Bridgett summarized decisions needed for the options available in the category and funding model. She then requested a public hearing to receive input from the community before the Commissioners make their final decision.

Commissioner Morgan noted a number of non-profits had approached him concerning using the GOCCP software. We should examine who gets money and why, but indicated he felt the department heads have enough on their plates so the money should not run through them. He asked that an evening public hearing be held to allow for more public participation.

Commissioner Jarboe noted the VCCs provide services we need, but sometimes we do not know what the return on investment is. One reason to have departments involved is to take a hard look at the services that are being provided.

Commissioner O'Connor indicated having the department heads tracking accountability of non-profits is a good idea. He suggested having two public hearings, one in the morning and one at night.

Commissioner Hewitt said it's about time we bring other non-profits on board. He indicated he is in favor of department heads being the ones who look at the VCCs. He noted he would like to see some money set aside to allow and encourage new groups, those with new ideas to come forward and present them to us.

Commissioner Guy said he would like to see the non-profits funded through the departments.

I move to schedule the Non-Profit Funding Policy for Public Hearing.

7. COMMISSIONER'S TIME

The Commissioners highlighted events attended over the past week and provided general comments.

Commissioner Hewitt noted the Commissioners are working with Ben Grumbles, MD Secretary of Environment, to resolve the issue of the failing septic systems at St. Clements Shores. We are requesting a five-year permit to relax the fines to METCOM while they are working on a plan to resolve the issue. He then commented on a Letter to the Editor concerning Homestead Tax which is capped at 5%. I know 5% is hard for the elderly and the less fortunate and I support going from 5% to 3%, but first we need to understand that the cost could go up to \$900,000 per point, but I'm a proponent to reduce taxes.

Commissioner Jarboe noted that he, Commissioner Guy, Dr. Bridgett, and our development team will be going to Huntsville, Alabama today to learn the best practices they have used during the BRAC era. We will be heading up a trade delegation consisting of business leaders and developers to look at small community growth and smart growth.

Commissioner O'Connor stated he feels people were misinformed about the Navy Museum in a recent Newspaper article and rumors going around. He noted donations were being collected to build a memorial to Trooper 2 which crashed a few years ago and was hoping other Commissioners will consider donation to the Trooper 2 memorial. He said there is a link on his Facebook page for anyone wanting to donate. He suggested that the County's Ethics Ordinance is not stringent enough and should be looked at closely. He has looked at model legislation from other counties and jurisdictions and feels the County's is a little loose. You need to take accountability for your actions. Need to be transparent don't want people thinking you are doing some behind the scene deals.

Commissioner Morgan commented that the fatal accident last week on 235 that brought traffic to a stop helps remind him to continue his push for FDR Blvd. Electronic signage is an issue. This is a new era than when the ordinance was adopted. He noted he talked to Mr. Sparling and Mr. Shire and knows that letters were sent to individuals saying they were going to be penalized, but he wants individuals who received those letters to know that we are going to table that for now and readdress electronic signs. No penalties will be assessed at this time.

Secretary Kahn stated the goals of his department, provided an overview of the Consolidated Transportation Program for FY-2016 to FY2021, and outlined accomplishments to-date and future plans. He noted the Governor is committed to roads and bridges in the state and plans to restore the Highway User Revenue to 30% over the next 8 years. Thirty million dollars has been allocated to repave roads in St. Mary's County during the summer of 2016. He outlined items in the CTP pertaining to the County

- Intersection improvements at MD 5 (Point Lookout Rd) at Moakley Street and Abell Street
- Upgrade and widen MD 5 to provide shoulders from south of Camp Brown to the Ranger Station at Point Look;
- MD 5, Point Lookout Rd replace the bridge over Eastern Branch
- MD 4,Patuxent Beach Rd and Solomons Island Road, study to upgrade MD 4 between MD 2 and MD 235, including the Thomas Johnson Bridge and the intersection at MD 235
- Study to upgrade MD 5 between 243 and 245; MD5 Point Lookout Road
- Design of intersection, bridge, and drainage improvements along MD 5 at MD 246 and MD 471.

Following his presentation, Secretary Kahn asked to hear the concerns of the County and noted he had staff taking notes in case there were any questions that his staff could not answer today. Listed below are comments and areas of concerns presented.

Commissioner Hewitt

- Thomas Johnson Bridge is the number one top priority
- Want clarity on Thomas Johnson Bridge you say three phases; what is the order of the phases?
- Intersection Rt, 246 and Rt.5.
- Intersection Rt. 245 and Rt.5.
- Leonard's Grant on 245. Citizens requesting stop light. We have a school there and planning for a senior center and library at the same location
- Requested repaying of Rt. 235 to be done at night to alleviate traffic congestion as people are trying to get to work
- Safety issue requested all intersections in the County be checked for lane markings. Identified 2 specific intersections Rt. 235/Rt.245 and Rt.235/Rt. 246
- Intersection of Rt.5 and 245 crosswalk not timed properly does not allow enough time for people to walk across street

Commissioner O'Connor

- Consider stoplight on 245 at Leonard's Grant lowering speed won't necessarily bring people into compliance. (Response: State has lowered speed limit at SMECO entrance from 55 to 40 until you get to Macintosh Rd.)
- Rt. 5 north of Rt. 6 to the County line need to look at low cost traffic flow control especially in the area of the Farmers Market.
- You stated St. Mary's County had 845 people injured and 11 fatalities from traffic accidents. Can you provide the type of injuries and where accidents occurred? (*Response: Yes, staff will provide.*)
- Need school zone/speed zone at Mechanicsville School. requested a traffic study be done. Parents and teachers are complaining traffic is coming down Rt. 235 so fast it is hard to get out of parking lot.

Commissioner Morgan

- Thomas Johnson Bridge top priority.
- Woodland Acres needs immediate attention
- Rt.5 at Rt. 246 needs resolution
- County just approved more funds this morning to move the utilities for the airport project.

Senator Waugh

• Warrant triggers – Are they sharable with the public? (*Response: Yes, we will provide.*)

• Asked the status of Potomac Bridge? (Response: Nothing has changed, funding not in place.)

Delegate O'Donnell

- Thomas Johnson Bridge is important not just to us as a region but the state and the nation. Have national defense with NAVAIR on this side of bridge and Calvert Cliffs and Cove Point on Calvert side.
- Woodland acres small subdivision would like you to expedite alternative access. If you have full commitment for funding why haven't you set a timetable for completion? What is the hold up? (Response: Tim Smith will look into and respond next week.)
- Walter Francis Duke Airport very important to the County UMD research and development center being located here.
- Harry Nice Bridge Why have tolls not been lowered? (Response: Cash tolls will not be lowered EZ-Pass was lowered.)
- Rue Purchase Rd/Buck Hewitt Rd need intersection fixed. Lexington Park Rescue squad has difficulty making turn to go north.
- Highway User Revenues very important to us.

Delegate Morgan

- Did you say eventually Highway User Revenues will come back to the counties to let the counties take care of priorities? (*Response: Yes*)
- Working with your people to redesign the four-way stop at Clements customer service has been great
- Project at Moakley St.- when will we see something on that? (Response: Breakout should begin in 2018 probably 2 year project.)

Delegate Rey

- Pegg Road and Rt.235 need crosswalk at the light no way to walk across to Naval Air Museum.
- Buck Hewitt Rd. and Rt. 235— Would like to see four-way stop sign, but if not, we need curb redesigned to allow more room for ambulances heading north.
- Camp Brown Rd. to Ranger station want to make sure when you widen road you will use state land where available rather than property owners. (*Response: Yes we should and we will check into that.*)

Dan Burris, Mayor of Leonardtown

 Moakley/Abell Project - Want to clarify when you speak of breakout project at Moakley/Abell St., my understanding is you are planning on continuing that to the hospital. (*Response: Yes*) • Want clarification on Moakley/Abell - for the total Rt.5 project the vehicle traffic count is currently 30,000 with 50,000 projected, but the handout you gave for the breakout project shows 26,000 currently and 32,000 projected. Shouldn't the breakout project count be the same as the entire Rt.5 project? (Response: Yes, or around the same.)

Leslie Roberts, Leonardtown Council Member

- Clarks Rest is getting a stop light and people from Leonard's Grant will be able to access it, so that should alleviate some of traffic concerns on 245.
- Suggested installing a part time light at the entrance of Leonard's Grant like the one at Leonardtown High School which works to let buses enter in the morning and depart in the evenings.
