CAPT Fleming provided an overview of programs being conducted at NAS Patuxent River and Webster Field. She noted that several contract actions for base infrastructure projects are underway. Captain Fleming said she is looking forward to working with the Community and that her priorities are people and partnerships.

PUBLIC HEARING (TEFRA)

Commissioner Russell opened the Public Hearing at 1:48 pm.

Notice of public hearing was posted in the Enterprise Newspaper on September 19 and 26, 2014, and October 3, 2014. Ms. Kramer explained that authorization to issue \$3.7 million in Economic Development Revenue Bonds on behalf of King's Christian Academy will in no way count as a debt against the County; it is totally their debt and will allow them to obtain a lower interest rate. Mr. Fry provided an overview of the school, noting enrollment has increased over the past five years and additional classrooms are needed. The funds requested will provide for construction of additional space and alleviate the need to turn students away.

Commissioner Russell opened the hearing for public comment and closed it with no comments presented.

Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Morgan, to approve and sign the resolution approving the issuance of \$3.7million in Economic Development Revenue Bonds on behalf of King's Christian Academy, for the purposes identified in their submission, and authorize the Commissioner President and staff to execute the documents. Motion carried 5-0.
