CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner President Russell called the business meeting to order at 9:00 am in the Chesapeake Building meeting room, Governmental Center.

ADDITIONS/DELETIONS TO AGENDA

Dept. of Land Use & Growth Management Boundary Line Adjustment Plat for New Leonardtown Elementary School Site was added to County Administrator Time.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Morgan moved, seconded by Commissioner Morris, to adopt the minutes of December 6, 2011, as written. Motion carried 5-0.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

1. Draft Agenda for January 3, 2012.

2. Dept of Land Use and Growth Management (Phil Shire, Acting Director)

Commissioner Morgan moved, seconded by Commissioner Jones, that the Board of County Commissioners, being the owners of the property described as Tax Map 32, Grids 5 and 11, and Parcels 82, 339, and 225, sign the Boundary Line Adjustment Plat as presented, for the purposes of combining the multiple parcels into one and eliminating an access easement through the parcels situated in the center of the property. Motion carried 5-0.

3. Circuit Court (Teresa Weeks, Senior Legal Assistant)

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Morgan, to approve and authorize Commissioner President Russell to approve the Family Services Grant Award, Project #MD1220 from the Administrative Office of the Courts, in the amount of \$116,630.75 and the related budget amendment to decrease the project budget revenues and expenses by \$22,834.25 in accordance with the actual agreement/award. Motion carried 5-0.

4. Department of Public Works and Transportation (George Erichsen, Director)

Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize Commissioner President Russell to execute the budget amendment to return \$609.00 from the Emergency Equipment Shelter Project (PF 0705) to the FIN12 Account. Motion carried 5-0.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR ST. MARY'S COUNTY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011

Present: Elaine Kramer, CFO

Desiree Ridgell, Accounting Officer, Dept. of Finance Lisa Brown, Auditor in Charge of our engagement

Ms. Kramer provided FY2011 financial highlights for the County. As of June 30, 2011, the County's government funds reported combined fund balances of \$80.3M, an increase of nearly \$10M over the prior year. The general fund reflected an increase of \$13.9M. The capital projects fund reflected a decrease of \$4.8M. The fund balance for non-major funds increased \$765,923. The County's governmental fund balances at June 30, 2011 includes \$32.1M for capital projects, \$46.5M in general funds and \$1.6M for other non-major funds. The general fund balance includes \$.8M of inventory that is nonspendable. In addition, the general fund reflects assigned designations of approximately \$2.7M which includes encumbrances and a Rainy Day Fund of \$1.625M. The County's unassigned fund balance is approximately \$30.2M. Maintaining an unassigned fund balance is important at this time because of the uncertainty of State funding allocations, State costs that could be shifted to the County and potential federal downsizing. The County will continue to take a conservative approach on the budget by continuing to focus on expense reduction measures both as a part of budget adoption and also throughout the operational year.

Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Morgan, to accept the report of the independent auditor on the financial statements of St. Mary's County for Fiscal Year 2011, as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY: PROPOSED RESOLUTION DELEGATING ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITY CONCERNING PUBLIC WORKS

Present: George Sparling, County Attorney

George Erichsen, Director, Dept. Public Works and Transportation

In an effort to further streamline government processes, it was recommended that the Director of Public Works be given signature authority for routine administrative actions that would normally come before the Board. Board approvals will continue to be required for the following: (1) acceptance of roads and streets into the St. Mary's County road system; (2) posting of speed limits and traffic control devices; (3) issuance of letters of demand to sureties on account of a default by the obligor; and, (4) acquisition and disposition of fee simple interests in real property.

Commissioner Morris moved, seconded by Commissioner Morgan, to adopt the proposed resolution authorizing the Director of Department of Public Works & Transportation to perform specific administrative acts concerning public works, subject to compliance with County budgetary and fiscal policies, approval of documents for form and legal sufficiency, and the provision of copies of executed documents to the County Administrator. Motion carried 5-0.

DEPARTMENTS OF PUBLIC WORKS AND TRANSPORTATION AND LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT: DEVELOPMENT REVIEW STREAMLINING UPDATE

Present: George Erichsen, Director, Dept. Public Works and Transportation Phil Shire, Acting Director, Dept. Land Use and Growth Management

Mr. Erichsen and Mr. Shire presented several streamlining recommendations, some of which have already been implemented, to assist in the development review process. Initiatives included making pre-application meetings with development applicants voluntary rather than mandatory, reducing duplicative agency reviews, eliminating the multi-tiered process of requiring the record plat to be recorded prior to issuance of the grading and road construction permits, and providing the Director of Public Works and Transportation delegation of signature authority. Other streamlining initiatives are under consideration. Text amendment changes to ordinances affected by the new streamlining processes will be forthcoming.

Commissioner Morgan moved, seconded by Commissioner Jones, to direct staff to proceed as discussed in Executive Session regarding property acquisition related to FDR Blvd. Motion carried 5-0.

PUBLIC HEARING: PROPOSED REALIGNMENT OF MORGAN ROAD (COUNTY ROUTE 30173), AND PRESTON COURT – A PROPOSED PUBLIC ROAD SERVING PROPOSED BROYHILL SUBDIVISION

Commissioner Russell opened the Public Hearing at 5:30.

Present: George Erichsen, Director, Dept. of Public Works and Transportation Jonathan Blasco, P.E., Mehaffey and Associates,

Mr. Erichsen provided an affidavit affirming Public Hearing Postings on November 7, 2011. He also submitted a Certification of Publication and read the notice of public hearing for the Broyhill Subdivision into the record.

Mr. Blasco provided an overview of the 22 planned homes in the proposed Broyhill subdivision which situated on 110 acres abutting the right-a-way on Morgan Road. Connecting the subdivision to Morgan Road requires alteration of the roadway and creating a stopping situation. He displayed a map showing the best concept configuration for the orientation of the sharp turn.

Commissioner Russell opened the Public Hearing for public comments.

Public Comments. (Comments as noted below are intended as highlights of testimony given and are not verbatim.)

Bob Ratzingir, 24610 Morgan Road, Hollywood, MD 20636

- Why take an established community and dump another on into it
- Cannot get out of driveway now with 60 houses past my house
- With an average of 2 cars per household this will add approximately 50 cars
- What's wrong with opening Rd. to McIntosh
- No one in neighborhood in favor

Commissioner Russell asked for a show of hands from the audience of residents that were for or against this project going forward. Vote: Yea(0), Nay (25)

Nathan Salada. 24520 Morgan Road, Hollywood, MD 20636

- Lives at top of hill before you get to new proposed road
- Asked how many homes were going to be built
- If going to build deeper on property you are going be closer to McIntosh as entrance/exit
- Definitely against

Margaret Harless, 25085 Morgan Road, Hollywood, MD 20636

- Concerned with Broyhill subdivision
- Does it mean the subdivision is definitely going in
- How can we stop the subdivision from coming in
- Have you looked at other options to come into the new development like Pappy Way
- All houses prior to the new road have safety issues

Commissioner Russell said the development will have to go before the Planning Commission before it can be started and suggested that would be the time to speak out.

Malinda Frerichs, 24700 Morgan Road, Hollywood, MD 20636

- My house is in the 90 degree turn area, across from where the actual development is gong in
- Wasn't aware there is a separate meeting with planning commission can we get notice when it
- Will new subdivision be on MetCom
- Will we be forced to hook into MetCom if pipes go down Morgan Rd.
- Will the remainder of Morgan Road be widened
- Will road be under County maintenance once traffic begins
- Is County prepared for additional amount of maintenance that will be required
- Will electric lines be above or below ground
- Commented that County came in tried to put ditch in the turn and now all water drains in her backyard
- Is development going to stop with 22 houses

Commissioner Russell said we will make sure everyone who signed up gets a notice of the Planning Commission meeting on this issue.

Jonathan Blasco responded to some of the questions presented above. In the subdivision process LUGM takes care of the open file so information can be obtained there. If the developer decides to increase the lot count then public utilities would have to be installed. The subdivision when complete will have 22 lots. The developer wanted to come in from McIntosh but there were environmental issues. The new road was designed to new standards and will have a new ditch on both sides. SMECO handles electric not the developer so it is their option the type of lines installed (above ground or below).

- Stop signs on Morgan Road is going to make it more dangerous
- Can't see why a 3 way stop couldn't be used
- Concerned with number of people and new wells will it impact water table

PUBLIC HEARING: TO CONSIDER PROPOSED ALTERATION OF A PORTION OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY KNOWN AS LINCOLN AVENUE AND CONVEYANCE OF A PORTION OF THE SAME TO FIRST MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH IN LEXINGTON PARK

Commissioner Russell opened the Public Hearing at 6:12 pm.

Present: David Weiskopf, Deputy County Attorney Bill McKissick, Attorney for First Baptist Church

Mr. Weiskopf noted for the record a Posting of Public Hearing affidavit and read the Notice of Public Hearing that was published in *The Enterprise Newspaper* on November 30th and December 6th, 2011. In 1962 the First Baptist Church of St. Mary's County conveyed property to St. Mary's Count to widen Lincoln Avenue. A survey completed at that time showed all structures, including the existing Church to be outside the new right-of-way-line; however a recent survey shows that a portion of the existing church lies within the County's right-of-way. The actual traveled portion of Lincoln Ave is not affected by the encroachment and now representatives for the First Baptist Church of St. Mary's County are requesting that the County convey the encroachment area of the Church back to the Church.

Mr. McKissick explained that the First Baptist Church is in the process of procuring a loan to finance construction of a new church on a different site and the lender requires that the present church be included in the collateral. Settlement on the construction loan cannot be finalized until the portion of the land where the church is sitting is transferred to the Church.
