B. OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY - Resolution to Delegate Authority to the Commissioner President

Present: George Sparling, County Attorney

The proposed resolution will delegate authority to the Commissioner President to approve documents in the nature of "ministerial acts." The purpose is to increase governmental efficiency. The following items may be executed by the Commissioner President: (1)Execution of budget amendments for amount not exceeding One Thousand Dollars approved by the Chief Financial Officer; (2) Execution of acceptance grants substantially in compliance with applications previous approved by the Commissioners and approved by the Chief Financial Officer; (3) Execution of agreements and documents related to a transaction previously approved by the Commissioners and approved by the County Administrator and when appropriate, for form and legal sufficiency by the County Attorney; (4) Execution and approval of agreements,

documents, certifications and reports required in connection with provision of funding to the Commissioners of St. Mary's County by the Federal or State governments or by intergovernmental or regional agencies approved by the County Administrator; and (5) Confirmatory and corrective and documents approved by the County Attorney.

I move that the proposed Resolution authorizing the Commissioner President to perform specified ministerial acts be adopted.

C. FINANCE - Presentation of the FY2015 Audit and acceptance by the Commissioners of St. Mary's County

Mr. Murphy noted that the audit was performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards, and the results of the audit disclosed no instance of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under those standards. The result was an unmodified opinion or clean opinion, the highest one available. He recommended the Commissioners of St. Mary's County consider applying for the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report Award.

D. DEPT OF LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT - Approve Resolution to extend time for CSMC action on the Lexington Park Development District Mater Plan (LPDDMP)

Present: Phil Shire, Director, Dept. of Land Use and Growth Management

The LPDDMP is currently in the middle of the Commissioners of St. Mary's County public hearing process (Hearing conducted on Dec 8). Recently adopted state law, Chapter 288 (formerly HB 919), allows local elected officials to amend and adopt, modify, remand or disapprove comprehensive plans within a 90-day period, with a single 60-day extension approved by resolution. The Department of Land Use and Growth Management is

requesting the proposed resolution be approved extending action on the LPDDMP to March 1, 2016.

I move that the resolution to extend time for CSMC action on the Lexington Park Development District Master Plan for an additional 60 days be adopted."

4. PRESENTATIONS

A. MARYLAND PARK SERVICE - Presentation of Newtowne Neck State Park Master Plan

Present: Mary Owens, Chief of Planning, MD Park Service Christy Bright, Park Manager

Ms. Owens provided a comprehensive overview of the Newtown Neck State Park Master Plan. The park consists of 776 acres of agricultural fields, forests, meadows, marshes, and sandy beaches and is surrounded by Breton Bay, the Potomac River and St. Clement's Bay. The plan calls for ten miles of trails, two comfort stations, two kayak launches, two paddle-in campsites, beach access, fishing areas, a Natural Resource Police and transient pier, and parking to accommodate up to 100 vehicles.

B. DEPT OF LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT - Presentation of process for creation of a small-area master plan for the North County Town Center

Present: Phl Shire, Director, Dept. of Land Use and Growth Management

Mr. Shire explained the process for creation of a small-area master plan for the North County Town Centers. When developing a plan, all Federal and State requirements for Master and Small Area Plans will be followed along with consideration of the desires and concerns of the community, and recommendations from the Commissioners. Findings regarding sewerage disposal, development capacity, traffic capacity, and implications of historic and cultural resources will be presented to the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission will then draft a plan based on those findings and community needs assessments. Once a plan is drafted, the Planning Commission will conduct public hearings to receive additional community input prior to forwarding their Draft North County Town Center Plan to the Commissioners of St. Mary's County. The Commissioners will then conduct public hearings to revise and finally adopt the Plan.
