A note from Division Manager Karen Stone.

What a strange year this has been. We started out with wonderful plans for a full schedule of really great events, but the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting shutdowns altered those plans in more ways than we could have imaged. Nonetheless, we were not deterred in our efforts to stay out in front and give the public alternative ways to interact and stay engaged with us. We have been creative, gotten some things done that we'd been putting off, and taken advantage of this time to reflect on where we want to go as the St. Mary's County Museum Division.

The first thing we did – thankfully, just before the shutdown – was get the online version of the Museum Stores up and running. We had been talking about this idea for quite a while and were able to get it done just in time. That new offering has allowed us to bring in some income from online store sales, continue to receive donations and even accept membership renewals online for the first time ever. At Piney Point Lighthouse Museum & Historic Park, we took advantage of the absence of visitors to lay down new flooring on the first floor of the main building, paint the new exhibit areas on both levels and install a new temporary exhibit. The permanent second floor exhibit installation is also getting underway this month, so when we do reopen there will be a lot of new things to see!

The new building for the St. Clement's Island Museum got put on a hold for a short while this year but is back on track and beginning to move forward again. The project was just awarded a grant by the Maryland Heritage Area Authority to help with the fresh, innovative exhibits in the new building. In the meantime, we are running the water taxi to St. Clement's Island State Park every day, with a reduced number of passengers and a new set of safety precautions so that visitors can feel confident when coming to see us. The Museum Store is also open for people who want to shop while waiting for the taxi.

This summer, the Museum Division also took on and opened its fourth and newest property – the Old Jail Museum in downtown Leonardtown. This county-owned property will be open during the same hours as our other museums, plus special hours during Leonardtown events, once we can reopen again. This will give us a prime location to welcome visitors downtown and become more involved in Leonardtown happenings, especially as operation of the site is in partnership with the Town of Leonardtown, where the location will also serve as the official Leonardtown Visitor Center. In the meantime, it is being used as office space for staff and is scheduled to be open during Leonardtown's First Friday events. A Network to Freedom grant was just received for new exhibits being developed there, dealing with its role in the Underground Railroad.

We hope you have been following our Facebook pages and enjoying the weekly history videos and the highlights of fascinating objects from the museum collections. Online, you will also find some coloring pages, a video tour of the Blackistone Lighthouse and a whole lot more.

So, although we've been closed to the public, we have not been idle! We miss seeing you and look forward to sharing the new exhibits and the new site with you all when we return.

And while we have been mostly successful to-date in our continued efforts to secure State, Federal and local grants and funding to support the continued development of educational programs, new exhibits and to offset some COVID related expenses, the Friends are yet to realize the full impact of the closures to our revenues. Originally formed in 1984 as "Friends of the St. Clements Island Museum, Inc." and later changed to add "and Piney Point Museum" to the name, the Friends organization currently supports seven distinct historic sites/structures acquired over time and currently managed by the St Mary's County Museum Division however; our legal name only reflects two of those. The Board is considering a request to change our name to better reflect the entirety of the assets and potential for future growth. Please feel free to contact us with your thoughts.

We are also very pleased to announce the addition of Mr. Brian Williams as our newest Director replacing Maggie Hammett. Brian and his wife (Barbara) are dual residents of Colton's Point and Washington, D.C. where he works.
