### **APPROVAL OF THE BILLS/MINUTES**

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve the minutes of the Commissioners' meeting of January 24, 2006. Motion carried 5-0.

### APPROVAL OF CHECK REGISTER

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Check Register as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

### **PROCLAMATION**

# DEPARTMENT OF LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE COMPREHENSIVE WATER AND SEWER PLAN (CWSP)

## Tazelaar Property (CWSP#05-232-0017)

Mr. Jackman noted for the record that a public hearing was held on January 10, 2006, to consider a request to amend the CWSP for the Tazelaar property.

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to amend Service Maps III-34 and IV-34 to change the service area category from W-6 and S-6 (service in 6 to 10 years) to W-3D and S-3D (service in 3 to 5 years, developer financed) for 6.22 acres described as Tax Map 34, Grid 16, Parcels 33 and 441, the Tazelaar Property, CWSP #05-132-017, in the 8<sup>th Election District, in anticipation of the construction of 15 residential units. Motion Carried 5-0.</sup>

Virginia Knolls (CWSP #05-132-009)

Mr. Jackman noted for the record that a public hearing was held on January 10, 2006, to consider a request to amend the CWSP for the Virginia Knolls property.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to amend the Service Map III-34 and IV-34 to change the service area category from W-6 and S-6 (service in 6 to 10 years) to W-3D and S-3D (service in 3-5 years, developer financed) for 20 acres described as Tax Map 34, Grid 2, Parcel 327, Virginia Knolls, CWSP #05-132-009, in the 6th Election District, in anticipation of the construction of 100 townhouse units; and further, to request that the Planning Commission place serious consideration on the second means of access to the parcel, as well as the proposed access to the parcel through an existing parking area, as a matter of safety for the people that live in that community. Motion carried 5-0.

### STUDENT PRESENTATION

Ms. Morgan Smoot explained the curriculum for the kindergarten reading program. Students read their books to the Commissioners and received a commendation for their reading skills. Ms. Pistorio expressed her thoughts on the reading program, and Ms. Abell shared a picture of Mechanicsville's 5th grade class with the Governor of the State of Maryland during their trip to the Senate Building in Annapolis. The class was being honored by the Governor for their poster about inclusionary education.

- 2. Department of Recreation, Parks and Community Services (Cynthia Brown, Manager, CSD)
  - a. Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement to approve and authorize Commissioner President to sign the budget amendment that decreases the Injury Prevention Grant project budget by \$3,000, in order to align the project budget as the grant was not received. Motion carried 5-0.
  - b. Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement to approve and authorize Commissioner President to sign the budget amendment that decreases the Pilot Highway Safety Grant project budget by \$15,000, in order to align the project budget as the grant was not received. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe to increase of \$156,453 to the Board of Education FY 2006 Restricted Program Fund for eight (8) grants as submitted, which were approved by the Board of Education on January 11, 2006, and were awarded after the completion and approval of the FY 2006 Approved Budget document. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement to approve and sign a letter to the Maryland Agriculture Land Preservation Foundation showing FY2006 properties ranked using the Land Evaluation and Site Assessment (LESA) System. Motion carried 5-0.

5. Department of Land Use and Growth Management (Jeffrey Jackman, Sr. Planner, DLUGM)

Commissioner Dement moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley to approve and adopt the resolution to amend Resolution W/S 92-01 to assign an EDU to the property of Leonard Harding for Michael Haskins on Airedale Road described as Parcel 104.

Motion carried 5-0.

6. Emergency Communications Center (Timothy K. Cameron, Director and Shirley L. Copado, Mgr. ECC)

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement to approve and authorize Commissioner President to sign the 1st amendment to the existing Tower License between Crown Atlantic Company, LLC and St. Mary's County to provide for the incorporation of drawings that show the changed site location of a Maryland State antenna on the Mechanicsville Tower that was relocated at the request of the State of Maryland and to show the affected floor space dimensions in the shelter. Motion carried 5-0.

OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF: UPDATE ON ADULT DETENTION CENTER NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Sheriff Zylak and the consultant team presented plans for the following three concepts for the construction of a new minimum security building on two sites within the St. Mary's County Governmental Center site:

Concept A: Proposed as a free standing horizontal facility with all housing and support components

accessed from a main traverse corridor

Concept B: Connects the existing facility with an enclosed secure corridor to a new two-story minimum security building.

Concept C: Identical to Concept B; however, there is no direct connection to the existing jail and its

location is slightly further south.

The Sheriff's Office requested approval of Concept B so that the vendor may proceed with Phase II of the Local Jail Construction Project. Submission is due to the State of Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services on June 30th, 2006. Following a discussion of the plans, the Commissioners agreed that more time was needed for consideration and to return the request to a future agenda for decision.

Commissioner Raley asked that the Town of Leonardtown be contacted for affirmation of the parking situation.
