Commissioner Dement moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment in the amount of \$15,231, closing out Project PF0405, Airport Environmental Assessment, to the FIN07 account. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Public Works Agreements for Avonlea Subdivision, Section 2, Phases 2 and 3, located in the 5th Election District, both with expiration dates of March 1, 2008. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Public Works Agreement for Murphy Subdivision, located in the 6th Election District, with an expiration date of April 1, 2008. Motion carried 5-0. Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment in the amount of \$1,775 decreasing the FY07 budget for the MIEMSS Emergency Medical Dispatch, aligning the project with the actual expended grant amount, and increasing the Supplemental Reserve. Motion carried 5-0.

4. Dept. of Recreation, Parks and Community Service (Phil Rollins, Director)

Commissioner Dement moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to endorse the Application for Funding in the amount of \$30,000 from the National Recreational Trails Program for Phase IV-A of the Three Notch Trail and to sign the related letter of consent. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendments closing-out the following projects to the FIN 07 Capital Reserve:

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment transferring funds in the amount of \$2,042, closing-out the Countywide Maintenance Grant (MD0508), to the Supplemental Reserve Account. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment transferring funds in the amount of \$7,798, from the Supplemental Reserve Account to the Countywide Maintenance Grant (MD0608). Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to authorize the Contracting Officer to execute the contract for the Wicomico Shores Golf Course Clubhouse renovation and expansion construction project in the amount of \$1,922,033, as requested in the June 7, 2007 Contract Award Recommendation for Golf Course Clubhouse memorandum, signed by both the Director, Recreation, Parks and Community Service and the Procurement Officer, and to sign the Resolution "Authorizing Issuance and Sale of General Obligation Bonds", endorsing Option B, 20 Year Term, at 5.62%. Motion carried 5-0.

5. **Department of Aging** (*Jennie Page, Deputy Director; Peggy Maio, Fiscal Supervisor*)

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Notification of Grant Award for the Senior Health Insurance Program for federal funding in the amount of \$13,124. Motion carried 5-0. 6. Office of the County Attorney (Liz Passarelli, Real Property Mgr.)

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Temporary Railroad Right-of-Way Easement Agreement for the construction of a sewer main to proposed 3N building, to be located on the northbound side of MD Rt. 235 in California. Motion carried 5-0.

7. Dept. of Finance (Elaine Kramer, CFO)

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize realigning \$23,077 in unused exempt financing proceeds from other County government departments to the Sheriff's 2007 vehicles project, increasing the unapplied portion of the Sheriffs' vehicles funding for the 07 exempt financing to \$51,483, and authorizing staff to utilize funds to install AVLs in as many as possible sheriff's vehicles, and to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment realigning \$5,225 in budgeted payments for the debt service on the exempt financing in FY2008, reflecting the realignment of proceeds. Motion carried 5-0.

8. **Dept. of Economic and Community Development** (*Dennis Nicholson, Executive Director, Housing Authority*)

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Resolution endorsing a Community Block Grant Application providing assistance for economically displaced residents of National Mobile Home Park and White Oak Mobile Home Park, and the related Statement of Assurances and Certifications. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to adjourn as the Board of County Commissioners and to convene as the St. Mary's County Board of Health. Motion carried 5-0.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SITTING AS THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

Present: Dr. Icenhower, Health Officer Tracy Kubinec, Deputy Health Officer Nancy Luginbill, Dir., Health Services Daryl Calvano, Dir., Environmental Health The following topics were presented and discussed:

<u>Clarification of FY2008 Health Department Budget Deficit (Tracy Kubinec)</u> St. Mary's County Health Department (SMCHD) has been projecting a deficit for FY2008 for a number of months. 92% of the Health Department's budget is personnel costs. SMCHD is staffed by State employees, but unlike other state agencies, all cost of living adjustments (COLA), step increases , retirement, and health insurance increases mandated by the state are not automatically funded by the state. SMCHD submitted their budget request to St. Mary's County Government in February 2007, requesting a 4.7% increased based on these personnel costs.

Causes of the FY2008 \$300,000 deficit: Increased personnel costs of \$250k and decrease in collections of \$50k (Environmental Health Service Fee). Ms. Kubinec reviewed solutions to cover the FY2008 budget shortfall including staff reductions due to attrition, increase of funding from the County and state core funds, funding reallocation, and increasing Environmental Health Services Fees.

The impact of service, specifically transportation, and staff reductions was discussed. Ms. Luginbill provided an update relative to the school nurse program.

The County Administrator, John Savich, said that continuing issues with the budget will be flagged for discussion with the Delegation in the fall, and he will work with Dr. Icenhower to schedule a session (BOCC sitting as the Board of Health) earlier in the year next year.

<u>Public Hearing for Approval of Environmental Health Fees</u> (Daryl Calvano) In regard to the increase of Environmental Health Services fees, the last time the fees were raised was two years ago, effective date of August 2005. Previous to that, the last time fees were raised was in 1998. Costs for personnel, gasoline, and electricity have greatly increased in the past two years. A 6% increase in environmental health fees is being proposed.

It was clarified by Christy Chesser, County Attorney, that a public hearing and adoption of a revised Ordinance will be required prior to any increase in the Environmental Public Health fees.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to direct staff to schedule a public hearing to consider and receive public testimony on the request to increase Environmental Public Health fees. Motion carried 5-0.

Clarification of 2% indirect cost charge on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA) funds distribution the Marcey House and Walden-Sierra (Tracy Kubinec)

The BOCC and the Maryland State Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA) in June 2006 decided that oversight was needed on the \$3M public funds distribution to St. Mary's County prevention and treatment providers. As a result of this decision, effective in FY2007, an Addictions Coordinator position was established at the SMCHD to provide monitoring and oversight.

There was discussion regarding responsibilities and funding for the Addictions Coordinator position. Prior to this position, Finance staff provided funding monitoring and oversight support. Concern regarding program vs. administrative funds was expressed by Commissioner Mattingly, who stated that he was not aware that funding for the Addictions Coordinator position would require reductions with core services and programs. Mr. Savich will work with Dr. Icenhower and the other agencies regarding ADAA funding and oversight issues and schedule follow-up discussions on a future BOCC agenda.

Ms. Kubinec provided clarification regarding the 2% indirect cost charge on ADAA funds. The definition from the State of Maryland Local Health Department Funding Systems Manual was reviewed.
