CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am.

AGENDA APPROVAL

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to approve the agenda as distributed.

APPROVAL OF CHECK REGISTER

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Check Register dated July 10, 2007, as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Russell noted his request for mileage reimbursement will be pulled and redirected to the State of Maryland.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to adopt the minutes of the Commissioners' meeting of June 26, 2007, as amended. Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Raley clarified the change to the minutes.

INTRODUCTION: Bob Schaller, Director, Dept. of Economic & Community Development (DECD)

Mr. Bob Schaller, new Director, DECD, was introduced and welcomed by the Board. Before assuming the DECD Director position, Dr. Schaller served as the department chair and Professor for Business, Economics and Legal Studies at the College of Southern Maryland.

RETIREMENT RECOGNITION: Monika Kopel, County Commissioners' Office

Monika Kopel was recognized by the Board for over 12 years of dedicated service with St. Mary's County Government.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Emergency Shelter Grant application, Federal Fiscal Year 2007, for funds to finance homeless prevention activities and services provided to St. Mary's County residents. Motion carried 5-0.

3. **St. Mary's County Dept. of Social Services** (Jeannett Cudmore, Deputy Director, Department of Finance)

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment reducing the FY2007 BOCC Appropriation Reserve by \$1,300 and increasing the Department of Social Services account for burial expense reimbursements. Motion carried 5-0.

4. **St. Mary's County Circuit Court** (Judge Michael J. Stamm, Circuit Court; William Tench, Court Administrator)

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Budget Amendment for \$58,386 increasing Project MD0825, Maryland Drug Treatment Court Commission, aligning the project with the actual grant amount, and decreasing the Supplemental Reserve, effective July 1, 2007. Motion carried 5-0.

5. Dept. of Recreation, Parks and Community Service (Phil Rollins, Director)

Commissioner Dement moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the FY2008 Waterway Improvement Fund Application and Project Agreement for the Sanitary Service Contract for St. Mary's County, in the amount of \$25,000. Motion carried 5-0.

6. Dept. of Public Safety (Dave Zylak, Director; Joseph Guyther, Mechanicsville Vol. Fire Dept.)

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Waterway Improvement Fund Application and Project Agreement, as a pass through grant to the Mechanicsville Volunteer Fire Department for the acquisition of marine rescue equipment, the Matching Fund Fire & Rescue Grant Agreement Form, and the related sub-recipient agreement. Motion carried 5-0.

7. **Dept. of Public Works and Transportation** (George Erichsen, P.E., Director)

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Waterway Improvement Fund Application and Project Agreement for the Kingston Creek Waterway Improvement Taxing District Project, through the State's DNR FY2009 Waterway Improvement Fund. Motion carried 5-0.

8. **Dept. of Land Use and Growth Management** (*Denis Canavan, Director*)

Mr. Canavan provided a status report on the following land use projects: Transferable Development Rights (TDRs), Adequate Public Facilities (APF) Task Force, Work Force Housing, Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan, Ryken High School Rezoning, APZ-2 Residence Restriction, Office Business Park (OBP) Text Amendment, and Residential Sprinkler Systems.

Commissioner Jarboe moved to make the appointments as read by the County Administrator, with the exception of MetCom, which should be voted on separately. The motion was not seconded.

Commissioner Raley offered a second motion.

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve the appointments as cited by the County Administrator. Motion carried 3-2. Commissioners Jarboe and Dement voted against the motion. Commissioner Jarboe noted his concern that a reappointment should have been made to the Metropolitan Commission rather than appointing a new member, but that he does not have any concerns with the individuals appointed.

DEPARTMENT OF LAND USE AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT: ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT CHANGES TO THE TRANSFERABLE DEVELOPMENT RIGHTS (TDRS) PROGRAM AS GOVERNED BY CHAPTERS 26 AND 32 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE

Present: Denis Canavan, Director

Mr. Canavan reviewed the changes to the draft Ordinance that were made as a result of the Board's comments at the June 26, 2007, Board of County Commissioners meeting; i.e., in Section 26.11 changed the number of children exempted lots from three (3) to two (2) lots, changed the length of ownership of the lot by a child from five (5) years to seven

(7) years, and further defined the term "children." Mr. Canavan continued by reviewing the changes to the St. Mary's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, referencing Exhibit A, which is a mark-up of Chapter 26 "Transferable Development Rights (TDRs)" and Chapter 32 "Property Development Regulations". The mark-up shows the changes and additions made to both chapters.

Commissioner Raley questioned if footnote 8 (Schedule 32.1 Development Standards) would be eliminated. Mr. Canavan replied that footnote 8 has been modified to reference grandfathering in accordance with Section 26.13. Mr. Canavan read footnote 8 and stated the footnote is applicable until July 24, 2007 (the Ordinance Amendment Effective Date).

LU&GM will be publishing informational brochures and will be placing information on the website regarding how changes will be implemented.

Commissioner Mattingly questioned when the fee in lieu will be set. Mr. Canavan replied

That this will happen after the comparables are determined. The Director, DECD will determine the average price of TDRs over the next 12 months and will bring back to the Board next year to determine the fee in lieu amount. It was questioned if the fee in lieu should be established when the ordinance amendment becomes effective. Mr. Canavan replied that there is no database with data to set the price of a TDR and suggested using the comparable price per acre as established by the Maryland Agriculture Land Preservation Program. Mr. Canavan then offered to come back to the Board with a recommendation. It was questioned if the exact value for TDRs over the past year is known. The response was no. The County Attorney, Ms. Christy Chesser, clarified that the fee in lieu (cost) is not included in the Final Instruments and is not recorded in any document. Mr. Savich replied that he will follow-up regarding disclosure requirements and get back to the Board with that information.

Commissioner Raley asked about tracking TDRs; e.g., how does LU&GM track when they are taken off and put back on a piece of property. Mr. Canavan replied that a method to serialize and track TDRs is being put in place and meetings with Legal and the Office of Land Records, who records all three legal instruments, are in progress.

Commissioner Mattingly requested that a history/record be created of TDRs that have been transferred and asked Ms. Chesser if the ordinance can be adopted as presented or if additional language regarding the establishment of a fee for the first year needs to be included. Ms. Chesser replied that the existing language can be used (don't need to change anything); and the Director, DECD, will do research and come back before the Board with information for the coming year.

Mr. Savich clarified that the Director, DECD, will present the fee in lieu within 30 days following the end of a fiscal year. The BOCC will have an additional 30 days to increase or decrease the DECD's annual determination.

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to approve and sign the Ordinance regarding the Zoning Text Amendments on the Transferable Development Rights (TDRs) zoning provisions at Chapters 26 and 32 of the St. Mary's County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance previously approved at the June 26, 2007, Board of County Commissioners meeting, with an Effective Date of July 24, 2007.

Motion carried 4-1. Commissioner Jarboe voted against the motion noting that he voted against the ordinance as written because of affordable housing concerns. Stating that "future affordable housing will be eliminated for three-fourths of the County," Commissioner Jarboe said he hopes the promise to correct this during future legislative review is kept.
