Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Check Register as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Department of Economic & Community Development: Rockin' and Reel-in Fishing Contest

Dept. of Land Use & Growth Management: Proposed Zoning Map Amendment re Sewer Capacity Associated with Ryken's Annexation

The County Commissioners' Public Hearing on this proposal was held on July 11, 2006. The purpose of the hearing was to consider amending the Official Zoning Maps of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance to change zoning overlay designation of the property known as Parcel 7, Grid 7, Tax Map 41, owned by St. Mary's Ryken, Inc., from Resource Conservation Area (RCA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA). The proposed amendment corrects a zoning classification error that was in Ordinance 90-11 and carried forth in the adoption of the St. Mary's County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance in 2002.

No additional comments were received during the open record period following the hearing.

The next step in the process is to submit the request to the Critical Area Commission.

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, that Zoning Map-41 be amended to change the Critical Area overlay on Parcel 7, Tax Map 41, Ryken High School, from RCA to IDA as recommended by staff and by the Planning Commission. Motion carried 4-0.

Department of Public Works & Transportation: Discuss CIP New Meeting Room and Front Porch Addition Project Alternatives

Mr. Erichsen provided a schedule, bid process update, and cost and time proposals for project options under consideration, including the possible upgrading of the existing building.

Renovating the Governmental Center versus building a new building and the need to consider options in the interim, such as replacing carpet, tile, and painting, was discussed. Commissioner Jarboe suggested contacting the Historic Preservation Committee regarding possible historic significance of the Governmental Building.

It was clarified that the new meeting room is not just for the Commissioners, but is needed to provide adequate seating for public attendance at hearings and other public meetings. The meeting room is also used by various other County departments and committees.

The Board directed staff to proceed with plans to build a new meeting room, to include a "roughed-in" second floor. Potential second floor occupants and space needs issues will be addressed later in 2007, along with the necessary upgrades to the Governmental Center.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to direct staff to proceed as discussed in Executive Session with regards to Property Acquisition. Motion carried 4-0.

Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to direct staff to proceed as discussed in Executive Session with regards to Litigation matter. Motion carried 3-1. Commissioner Jarboe voted no.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to authorize Commissioner President to sign the Right of Entry Agreement as discussed in Executive Session. Motion carried 4-0.

Public Hearing: Fifth Amendment to Sheriff's Office Retirement Plan

The purpose of the Public Hearing was to address the Fifth Amendment to the Sheriff's Office Retirement Plan that encompasses four changes. Ms. Sabo provided a summary review of the Plan changes:

Change 1 (Section 2.02(f)): Deletes the requirement that a participant must resume employment with the Sheriff's Office within one year of military deployment in order to receive service credit for that military service. The reemployment requirements vary depending on the length of deployment. The amendment will now simply reflect that we will comply with the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act.

Change 2 (Section 2.07): Deleted the clause that stated a participant must elect within one year of hire date to purchase service credit from another government employer. This change resolves a conflict in the plan document that allows a participant to make such an election at any time.

Change 3 (Section 2.09(c)): Clarifies the five year limit on military service credit for service performed *prior to employment* with the Sheriff's Office. Credit for military service performed during *a leave of absence* from the Sheriff's Office will be calculated in accordance with the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (Section 2.02(f)). Change 4 (Section 4.04 (e)(4)(i)): Deleted the requirement for participants who receive a disability benefit to furnish a copy of his or her federal income tax return each year. The Board of Trustees is in the process of amending the Disability Procedures to delete this requirement. Participants will only be required to submit an affidavit verifying employment, income, and other disability benefits.

There was no public comment presented at the Public Hearing. The hearing was closed, but will remain open for written comments for ten days.
