APPROVAL OF CHECK REGISTER

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to authorize the Commissioner President to sign the Check Register, as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to adopt the minutes of the Commissioners' meeting of October 10, 2006, as corrected. Motion carried 4-0.

PROCLAMATION: BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

The County Commissioners presented a Proclamation to Marta Kelsey, Chairperson, Commission for Women, proclaiming October 2006 as Breast Cancer

Awareness Month in St. Mary's County. The County Commissioners joined with volunteers from the Commission for Women and the St. Mary's Hospital to

encourage and create awareness among women residents about their good health by discussing an age-appropriate screening program with their health care providers

that includes routine mammography, examination by a physician and breast self-examination.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to approve and authorize the Commissioner President to sign the FY2007 Statewide Special Transportation Assistance Program Operating Assistance Grant, Grant Addendum, and related Budget Amendment, to be in accordance with the actual grant award. PUBLIC HEARING: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ST. MARY'S COUNTY PUBLIC ETHICS ORDINANCE

The purpose of the Public Hearing was to discuss proposed Amendments to the St. Mary's County Public Ethics Ordinance (2006 Amendment). Mr. Deaderick reviewed the proposed changes, with the most significant being identified as to Section 5, D

'Solicitation or acceptance of gifts'.

Amendments (revisions) were submitted to the State Ethics Commission to ensure conformance. Discussion ensued regarding board, commission, and committee positions included in the Ordinance (Re: Section 6).

There were no signatures on the Public Hearing sign-up sheet.
