Mr. Canavan noted that a public hearing was held on the proposed textamendment on December 6 and most testimony was in support of the proposed amendment.

Commissioner President McKay noted the attendance of Dr. Sal Raspa,President, Board of Education, and Dr. Michael Martirano, Superintendent ofSchools.

Commissioner Jarboe proposed that the land for the proposed school site betransferred into the Lexington Park Development Plan and that Myrtle Point betransferred out of the Plan.

Commissioner Raley expressed concern that the proposed action would establish precedent that sewer could be extended beyond the Development Districtboundary into the RPD, which would seriously hamper our ability to managegrowth. Commissioner Mattingly moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to acceptand adopt the findings of the Planning Commission and approve the proposedamendment to the St. Mary's County Comprehensive Water and Sewer Plan forservice to schools in the Rural Preservation District (RPD) as recommended by the Planning Commission for the text amendment, including editorial changesrecommended by the Commissioners. Motion failed, 2-3. Commissioners Dement, Jarboe and Raley voted no.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Raley, to accept andadopt the findings of the Planning Commission and approve the proposed amendmentto the St. Mary's County Comprehensive Water and Sewer Plan for service toschools in the Rural Preservation District (RPD) as recommended by the Planning Commission for the text amendment asmodified by staff in this resolution, with a sunset clause provision with aneffective date of January 1, 2007.
