CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 9:10 a.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to approve the minutes of the Commissioners' meeting of Tuesday, August 29, 1990. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF BILLS

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to approve payment of the bills as submitted. Motion carried.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S ITEMS

Present: Edward V. Cox, County Administrator

1) HOMELESS SERVICE PROGRAM AGREEMENT

The County Administrator presented the referenced Homeless Service Program Agreement for Fiscal Year 1991 between Maryland State Department of Human Resources and St. Mary's County Government for Shelter, Nutrition and Service program to be effective November 1, 1990. The amount of the award is \$58,000.

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Agreement as presented. Motion carried.

2) <u>LETTER OF APPRECIATION</u> CITIZEN ADVISORS' APPRECIATION NIGHT

The County Administrator presented correspondence to certain businesses in the County for their contributions to the Citizen Advisors' Appreciation Night held August 24, 1990.

The Commissioners agreed to sign and forward the letters.

OFFICE ON AGING RSVP PROGRAM VOLUNTEER

The County Administrator presented a memorandum dated September 4 from the Personnel Officer requesting that the RSVP Program Volunteer within the Office on Aging be changed from permanent part time to part time because of lack of grant funds.

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve the change as requested. Motion carried.

4) GENERAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR SOUTHERN MARYLAND

The County Administrator presented a memorandum dated August 28, 1990 from Chairman of the Tri-County Council regarding the General Development Plan for Southern Maryland. The memorandum indicates that legislation mandates that TCC prepare a general development plan for Southern Maryland and that the plan be reviewed every four years. The current plan is dated, and Chairman Middleton recommends that Tri-County Council Director Hodge meet with the planning directors of the three counties to discuss preparation of the plan. County Administrator Cox recommended the Commissioners' endorsement of this effort.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster to accept this recommendation.

5) BUDGET AMENDMENT NO. 91-05 PUBLIC WORKS

The County Administrator presented the referenced Budget Amendment recommended for approval by the Director of Finance with the following justification: To provide additional funds for new Sierra House. Funds to be taken from county's share of Walden project because state grant fell through. County Administrator Cox stated that \$41,500 budget amendment is due to bids coming in higher than projected.

Commissioner Loffler suggested that the Commissioners look at at the exact nature of the Sierra House project prior to transferring any funds from the Walden project to the Sierra project.

Later in the meeting Mr. Ichniowski, Director of Public Works, stated that the project is in the schematic phase of design and the Walden Board is looking at three plans. Once a decision is made on the plans, the Walden Board will be coming before the Commissioners regarding this.

In conclusion the Commissioners agreed to defer a decision on the Budget Amendment until after the Walden Board comes before the Board to explain the project.

6) ST. CLEMENTS ISLAND - TOUR BOARD

As a follow up to last week's discussion, the County Administrator presented correspondence to Secretary of Natural Resources Torrey Brown formally requesting assistance relative to providing tour boat service to St. Clements Island.

The Commissioners agreed to sign and forward the letter.

7) RUNAWAY AND HOMELESS YOUTH PROGRAM GRANT

On behalf of Walden-Sierra the County Administrator presented the following relative to the Runaway and Homeless Youth Program:

- Grant Modification in the total amount of \$111,758.
- Grant Application for Start Up Costs in the amount of \$3,939.

Commissioner Lancaster moved, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign to sign the referenced documents. Motion carried.

MARYLAND ROCK NON-CONFORMING USE REVIEW

Present: Jon Grimm, Director, Planning and Zoning William C. Dutton

As requested by the Commissioners, the referenced individuals appeared before the Board to discuss the status of Mr. Dutton's review of Maryland Rock's Non-Conforming Use. Mr. Grimm stated that the Board had authorized funding for an independent investigation into the public record of the Maryland Rock property to determine the nature and physical description of the non-conforming use at Abell's Wharf. Mr. Grimm indicated that Mr. Dutton has been meeting with him and the County Attorney on this issue, and one extension of his contract has been granted.

In closing Mr. Grimm advised that the report should be complete later in September, and once completed will be presented to the County Commissioners.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1) ADDENDUM TO PUBLIC WORKS AGREEMENT CEDAR COVE - SECTION IV

Mr. Ichniowski presented an Addendum to the Public Works Agreement between Heritage Manor Homes, Inc. and St. Mary's County Commissioners extending the deadline for completion of improvements in Cedar Cove Subdivision, Section IV, Eighth Election District to March 1, 1991. The Addendum is backed by an amended Letter of Credit with Maryland Bank and Trust in the amount of \$511,400.

Commissioner Thompson moved, seconded by Commissioner Lancaster, to approve and authorize Commissioner Loffler to sign the Addendum as presented. Motion carried.

2) STREET LIGHTING CHANGE ORDER ST. JOSEPH PROJECT KING KENNEDY ESTATES
