7. Erosion and Sediment Control Plan Review Fees Ordinance

Letter dated September 8 forwarding draft Ordinance for proposed increase to the erosion and sediment control review fee as previously requested by the Commissioners. Staff requested approval to proceed with scheduling of a public hearing on the proposed Ordinance (tentatively scheduled for October 7, 1997).

Commissioner Brugman moved, seconded by Commissioner Chesser, to authorize taking the proposed Erosion and Sediment Control Plan Review Fees Ordinance to public hearing. Motion carried.

8. Critical Area Grant Proposal for Fiscal Year 1998

Also Present: Jon Grimm, Director, Planning and Zoning

Grant provides continuance of the Critical Area Grant for Fiscal Year 1998, which funds portions of the salaries for personnel involved in implementation of the County's Critical Area Program. Mr. Grimm advised that the grant funds were included in the FY '98 budget.

Commissioner Chesser moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to approve and authorize Commissioner Thompson to sign the Grant Application as presented. Motion carried.

During discussion Mr. Grimm requested that the Commissioners consider changing the fee schedule during the FY '99 budget cycle and agreed to work with the Finance Director relative to these fees.

The referenced representatives from SMECO appeared before the Commissioners to present a Capital Credit check in the amount of \$5,905, which reflects the County's share of what is left over after the Co-op pays all its expenses.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' TIME

United Way Campaign

Commissioner Thompson advised that she and Commissioners Eagan and Chesser attended the 1998 United Way Kick Off, and that she and Commissioner Eagan had discussed ways to increase participation by St. Mary's County Government employees. She suggested that the County Administrator appoint a Coordinator who could work with United Way and arrange for some opportunities for employees to be given more information about what United Way is doing in the County so that they would be willing to participate.

The Commissioners gave their concurrence.

St. Clements Shores Intersection View Obstruction

Commissioner Brugman stated that in the Spring he had received a telephone call regarding bushes that were blocking sight distance at an intersection in St. Clements Shores, and that Public Works had trimmed them; however, they have now grown back and Public Works has again trimmed the bushes. He stated that the bushes are on an unbuilt and unbuildable lot and that the property owner lives in Florida. He requested that staff check with the County Attorney to see if the County can remove the hedges out of the interest of public safety.

Community Action Teams

Commissioner Eagan advised that she attended the Community Action Team meeting with Patuxent Homes, Spring Valley, and Southampton citizens and that the meeting was also well attended by representatives involved with Hot Spots. The representatives explained how the Hot Spots grant funds would be used and will attend a future meeting to inform the citizens as to how the programs are working.

PUBLIC HEARING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION EMERGENCY SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

The Commissioners conducted a public hearing on a Supplemental Appropriation in the amount of \$250,00 from the undesignated fund balance to the Office of the County Administrator for the purpose of funding a comprehensive assessment of the County's emergency communications requirements by MCI Systemhouse. The assessment will include specific recommendations regarding the upgrade and consolidation of St. Mary's emergency communications facilities as well as upgrade or replacement of existing equipment.

Mr. Hicks read the Notice of Public Hearing which was published in *The Enterprise* newspaper August 27 and September 3.

Commissioner Thompson questioned the number of RFP's that had been distributed, and Mr. Haley indicated there were 30 vendors who could have submitted bids; however, only one was received, which was MCI Systemhouse. In addition Commissioner Thompson requested Mr. Hicks to explain to the public the Undesignated Fund Balance. He responded that the Undesignated Fund Balance are funds that have been retained by the County that have not been designated for a specific purpose. The County retains a 5% Reserve.

Hearing no further comments the public hearing was closed; the record will remain open for ten days for additional comments.

In response to an article in the *Today* newspaper, Commissioner Chesser stated that there was apparently a misunderstanding, that he was very much in support of improving the communication services and for ensuring public safety to the people of St. Mary's County.

THIRD CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE

Judges Briscoe and Kaminetz appeared before the Commissioners to provide a status report on a third Circuit Judge. Judge Briscoe indicated that statistical data from the Administrative Office of the courts indicates that the population of the county per judge and the increased case load per judge warrants the need for the third judge. Approximately five years ago St. Mary's County had been certified by the legislature and the Administrative Office of the courts for the third Circuit Court Judge.

Judge Briscoe further explained to the Commissioners that although the new space at the Courthouse will not be completed for two years, he believed that temporary facilities could be provided until the new facilities are available. The appointment should be effective October 1, 1998 and that he and Judge Kaminetz will be working with the Finance Office to develop the needed support.

Via the speaker phone, Mr. Welkos advised that five bids were received for the sale of St. Mary's County Consolidated Public Improvement Project and Refunding Bonds of 1997. The Bonds will provide funds to finance or refinance certain capital projects, to finance the establishment of a revolving loan fund for certain volunteer fire, ambulance and rescue departments, and to currently refund all outstanding maturities of the County's Public Facilities Refunding Bonds of 1986. Bids were as follows: Merrill Lynch & Co. - \$25,645,086.65 -4.8699%; ABN AMRO Chicago Corp. - \$26,419,107.95 - 4.7989%; Interstate/Johnson Lane Corp. - \$26,397,350 - 4.830%; Ferris Baker Watts, Inc. - \$26,397,752.55 - 4.796782%; Legg Mason - \$26,397,350 - 4.78959%.

Mr. Welkos recommended that the Commissioners award the bid to the lowest bidder, Legg Mason was the lowest bidder at the rate of 4.78959%.

Commissioner Chesser moved, seconded by Commissioner Eagan, to approve and sign Resolution No. 97-35 awarding the bid to Legg Mason as recommended. Motion carried.
