This weekend event features special period tours of Blackistone Lighthouse, a showing of the silent movie *The Lighthouse by the Sea* and more.

St. Clement's Island Art Kids with art instructor Ms. Ellen Duke Wilson is happening again this year. Join in and explore fine arts through a variety of artistic styles. Penny Press at St. Clement's Island

The Friends of St. Clement's Island and Piney Point Lighthouse Museum Store are pleased to announce the purchase of the first penny press machine installed at the St. Clement's Island Museum. The machine is located in the lobby of the museum and features original designs highlighting St. Mary's County treasures associated with the museum division.

Jayne Walsh, the Friends Museum Store manager has been enthusiastic about Penny Press machines since her kids were little. "Penny press machines are a big draw for all family members, both as souvenirs and collectible items. A pressed penny at the St. Clement's Island Museum is the perfect inexpensive, 51 cent souvenir for children and adults." Jayne also sought feedback from museum team members. "The staff wanted a hand-crank machine so children can have a full interactive experience; from choosing and setting their design selection, inserting the coins and then cranking the large wheel that flattens the penny until they hear the clink of their elongated penny hitting the return cup."

The Friend's Museum Store would like to thank the community and patrons for their support in donations through our Friends Facebook page fundraiser and in the Friends Museum Stores "Spare Change" collections. \$443.14 has been raised through contributions that began as a campaign in September of last year. The Friends organization sponsored a large portion of the procurement costs as well, donating \$2,000 toward the \$3,850 cost.

The Penny Press Fundraiser is continuing; the goal is to buy a second penny press machine for the Piney Point Lighthouse location. The Friend's Museum Store continues to offer a \$1,000 business sponsorship opportunity that includes a permanent brass plate on the St. Clement's machine acknowledging the benefactor. 
