2. ST. MARY'S COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

A. BOARD OF HEALTH

Present: Dr. Meenakshi Brewster, St. Mary's County Health Officer

Dr. Brewster provided an update on COVID-19. She commented that the efforts of residents social distancing and disease containment are making an impact with the rate of increases in new cases. We are expecting less of a demand on the health care system than originally anticipated;

however, we are planning for more of a demand. There is a continuing concern of asymptomatic transmission. Dr. Brewster encouraged citizens to continue to social distance and use face coverings as required. The Governor has received additional COVID-19 testing kits and we are working on strategies to expand test availabilities in the county. Our collective actions are making a difference and saving lives in our county.

7. PUBLIC HEARING - FY2021 RECOMMENDED BUDGET, 41770 BALDRIDGE ST., LEONARDTOWN, MD 20650

A. DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE - Six Public Hearings as related to the FY2021 Recommended Budget

Commissioner President Guy opened the public hearing for the FY2021 Recommended Budget at 6:31 p.m. in the Chesapeake Building Meeting Room, Governmental Center. Following opening remarks Commissioner President Guy introduced the other Commissioners and staff assisting with the Hearings. He asked that Jeannett Cudmore present an overview of the proposed budget before Dr. Rebecca Bridgett moderates the public hearings.

Ms. Cudmore noted there would be six public hearings tonight: Constant Yield Tax Rate; Department of Land Use and Growth Management Advertising Fee; Department of Recreation and Parks Activity Fund Fees; Department of Recreation and Parks Wicomico Golf Fees; Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Tax; and the Fiscal Year 2021 Recommended Budget. She presented an overview of the \$259.8 million FY2021 Recommended Budget highlighting Revenue Sources and General Fund Expenditures. The budget exceeds the Constant Yield Tax Rate by .0119 and is funded by the County's current rate of \$.8478; an advertising fee to be paid by the applicant for the actual cost of advertising pertaining to Board of Appeals & Planning Commission meetings; an increase in various Recreation and Parks Activities; an increase in fees for Wicomico Golf Course; a rescue tax increase from 1.1 to 3.0 cents for the Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad. The FY2021 Recommended Budget includes County Departments funded at \$51.5 million, the Board of Education is approximately \$110 million; the Sheriff's Office \$48.9 million; College of Southern Maryland \$4.5 million; Board of Library Trustees \$2.9 million and Health Department at \$2.5M. Compensation for County employees includes the year two phase-in increase of 3.71% for non-sworn employees, a one-step merit, a 1% COLA and Top of Grade employees will receive a \$500 stipend.

Dr. Rebecca Bridgett moderated the following six public hearings. ALisa Casas received incoming calls for citizen comments.

Dr. Rebecca Bridgett opened the public hearing at 7:00 pm. There were no public comments. The hearing closed at 7:01 pm.

5. THE SEVENTH DISTRICT VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD TAX

Dr. Rebecca Bridgett opened the public hearing at 7:02 pm. There were no public comments. The hearing closed at 7:03 pm.

6. FISCAL YEAR 2021 RECOMMENDED BUDGET

Dr. Rebecca Bridgett opened the public hearing at 7:03 pm. Merrie Beth Nauman, Chair Chesapeake Charter School Alliance provided comments via video. The Commissioners received 46 emails for hearing #6. Dr. Bridgett closed the hearings for public comment at 7:21 pm and thanked the residents of St. Mary's County for their participation in tonight's hearings.

Commissioner President Guy provided closing remarks noting that six months ago when the budget was started revenue estimates were strong and expenditures were planned but in the last six weeks the world has changed with COVID-19. The Commissioners approved \$850,000 from the Commissioners reserves dedicated to COVID 19 and today we approved \$3 million from our fund balance and restricted spending. The Commissioners will continue to take action to keep the community safe and our government running efficiently during this emergency. On behalf of all the Commissioners, President Commissioner Guy, thanked citizens for their interest and participation in this process. He asked the Commissioners if they had any closing comments.

Commissioner Colvin thanked everyone for their participation tonight noting the Commissioners welcome all comments.

Commissioner Morgan also thanked citizens who called in and commented that the proposed budget was set before the pandemic so unfortunately things have changed with revenues. The Commissioners will have to revisit the budget estimates for revenue and expenses and CIP to make sure we have a balanced budget that will satisfy the needs of the County.

Commissioner President Guy reminded citizens that the public comment period for the six public hearings will remain open until Tuesday, April 28th.
