

Board met Jan. 26th. 1937

Minutes last meeting read and adopted.

Mrs. Lee Latham, Leonardtown, Md, Henry Morgan, Morganza, Md, Bessie Saxon, Hermanville, Md, Mary Hill, Valley Lee, Md., Frank Butler, Beachville, Md, applied for G. P. A.
The Board granted Mrs Latham, \$8.00 mon, Henry Morgan 4.00 mon. Frank Butler, \$4.00 mon.

Mrs. Burch of Welfare Board, requested Co. Comm. to purchase artificial limb for Jas. Johnson. Also requested Board to commit Mrs. Wm. Henry Hill of Laurel Grove to Alms House. Board took no action in either of these cases, but held same over for further information.

Clerk was directed to write Senator Coad, Dr. Chas. V. Hayden, & Mr Philp H. Dorsey, protesting the proposed diversion of Gasoline Tax receipts to General Fund. See Letters on file.

In reply to a letter from Dr. Chas. V. Hayden, requesting the Boards approval or dis-approval of House Bill #23, the Clerk was directed to advise Dr. Hayden the Co. Comm. left the matter to the judgement of the County's representatives at Annapolis. ###

Mr. Wilson Knight of Compton, Md. requested the Board to take over as a County Road the road leading from the Compton State Road, into Mr. Knights property.

Mr. Aleck Loker and Paul Bailey interviewed the Board with reference to providing for the payment of a bounty for the killing of Hawks, Owls & Crows. The amount of the bounty to be Hawks, .50, Owls .50, Crows .10. The Board agreed to provide for the payment of this bounty, provided the legislature passed the Enabling Act.

The Board directed the Clerk to write the State Roads Commission, to divert any funds available for construction of State Roads in St. Mary's County, for the present fiscal year, to the fund for improvement and maintenance of County Roads. See letter on file.

The Election Supervisors advised the County Commissioners the urgent need of New Registration Books. Also In as much as the names on the old books would have to be copied in the new books, the Supervisors of Elections recommended that a General Registration be held. This would bring the Registration Books up to date and eliminate a great many names no longer entitled to be on the books. The Election Supervisors pointed out the General Registration would cost very little more than the cost of transcribing to the new books.

The Board approved the holding of a General Registration, and the purchase of new books.

Clerk directed to write Mr. Dryden asking that W.P.A. workers in St. Mary's County, be assigned to the clearing and draining of roads, which the State forces will complete, in preference to W.P.A. employees completing the project in its entirety. See letter on file.

Board signed the papers committing Thomas Aloysius Ching of Morganza, Md. to Rosewood Training School.
