Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Miss Lettie M. Dent, Superintendent of Schools informed the Board that the repairs to the Leonardtown school building were nearly completed and invited the Board to inspect same. Miss Dent also asked the Board to advance from the funds, which had been agreed upon for this work, \$1500.00 so she could pay contractor a part of his money. The Board inspected the work done on the school and found same satisfactory and ordered that the Board of Education be paid \$1500.00 from the 1940 Surplus.

In consideration of the sum of \$60.00, which was duly paid, the Board executed deed conveying to Wm. P. Wise .3 of an acre of land from the Alms House Farm, as per survey and plat to be filed with the Clerk of the Court for recording among the land records of the County. The Board also decided that in case it ever decided to sell the corner across the State road from the lot Mr Wise has purchased they would give him the refusal of same.

C. B. Greenwell, Clerk requested the Board to furnish the room adjoining the Clerks office, for the use of the members of the Bar. Mr. Greenwell was asked to obtain an estimate of the cost of doing this.

Miss Martha Long appeared before the Board and stated that she actually performed the work of Registrar of St. Mary's County, and felt that if any one was receiving compensation for this work, it should be paid to her. Board took no action.

Board executed deed to Lamar Taylor for tax sale Property of Walter Bennett, 1st Dist.

Mrs G. B. Wilkerson, appeared before the Board and asked that the Patuxent Beach road, 6th Dist. be improved. Since the Board had already decided to improve a part of this road no further action was taken.

Clerk was instructed to write the State Roads Commission and inquire when bids for the Beauvue-Valley Lee road and the road from Loveville to the 3 Notch road would be advertised for.

B. M. Springer, 2nd Dist, appeared before the Board and stated that he had given the right-of-way through his farm for the Piney Point State road and felt that the old County road bed through his farm should revert to his farm. The Attorney to the Board ruled that this could be accomplished by the Board declaring this section of road to be abandoned. The Board took no action.

The Board decided to attend the meeting of the Western Shore County Commissioners at Frederick, Md. at 10.00 A.M. November 1, 1940.
