Baldwin, Architect discussed with the Board correspondence he had had concerning the F.W.A. project for a new Public High School at Great Mills, which indicated that while the F.W.A. had approved his plans for the building they did not intend that he should have supervision over the construction of same.

The Board decided to go to Washington on Nov, 3, 1943 and try to get Congressman Sasser to arrange a meeting with the head of the Public Housing Authority, and see if it cannot be arranged for Mr. Baldwin to have supervision over the construction of this school and also the new jail. Mr. Paul J. Bailey and Wm. Alec. Loker were invited to attend the meeting with Mr. Sasser.
