ORDINANCE NO. 3

WHEREAS, by Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Chapter 599 of the Acts of 1933, Title 5, Section 25 Enforcement and Remedies, and as amended by Chapter 808 of the Acts of 1945, it is provided that, "The Council may provide, by Ordinance, for the enforcement of this Act and of any Ordinance or Regulation made thereunder."

Section 1. Date effective—This Ordinance shall become effective October 15, 1945 and shall continue in force until repealed.

Section 2. Enforcement

1. All departments, officials, and public employees of St. Mary's County who are vested with the duty or authority to issue permits or licenses shall issue no such permit or license for any use, building, or purpose, if the same would be in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance. Any such permit or license, if issued in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be null and void.

2. In case any building or structure is erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, repaired, converted, or maintained, or any building structure, or land is used in violation of this Ordinance, or of the Enabling Act of 1933, as amended by Chapter 808, Acts of 1945, the County Commissioners shall, after inspection, order in writing the remedying of any such conditions found to exist therein or thereat.

3. If within thirty days, or longer time as the County Commissioners may in writing authorize, any conditions in violation of the terms of this Ordinance that have been ordered to be remedied still exist, it shall be the duty of the County Commissioners to institute appropriate criminal or civil proceedings.

4. The County Commissioners, in addition to other remedies, may institute any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent such unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, conversion, maintenance, or use; to restrain, correct, or abate such violation; to prevent the occupancy of said building structure or land or to prevent any illegal act, conduct, business, or use in or on the premises.

Section 3. Penalties

1. The owner or agent of a building or premises where a violation of any provisions of this

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
