ORDINANCE NO. 3

WHEREAS, by Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Chapter 599 of the Acts of 1933, Title 5, Section 25, Enforcement and Remedies, and as amended by Chapter 808 of the Acts of 1945, it is provided that, "The Council may provide, by Ordinance, for the enforcement of this Act and of any Ordinance or Regulation made thereunder."

Section 1 Date effective—This Ordinance shall become effective October 15, 1945 and shall continue in force until repealeds.

n force until repealed.
Section 2. Enforcement

1. All departments, officials, and public employees of St. Mary's County who are vested with the duty or authority to issue permits or licenses shall liste no such permit or license for any use, building, or purpose, of the same would be in canflict, with any of the provisions of this Ordinance. Any such permit or license, if issued in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, and license of this ordinance, and license of this ordinance, shall be null and void.

2. In case any building or structure is constructed, reconstructed, altered, repaired, converted, or maintained, or any building structure, or land is used in violation of this Ordinance, or of the Enabling Act of 1933, as amended by Chapter 808. Acts of 1945, the County Commissioners shall, after inspection, order in writing the remedying of any such conditions found to exist therein or thereat.

3. If within thirty days, or longer time as the County Computationers, may in writing authorite, any conditions in violation of the terms of this Ordinance that have been ordered to be remedied still exist, it shall be the duty of the County Commissioners to institute appro-



BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County, Maryland in regular meeting assembled, that the following coin operated machines displaying a metal tag or other tag, obtained under and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, shall be lagal and lawful in St. Mary's County:

All coin operated machines with revolving wheels or cylinders and commonly known as slot machines, or console machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all machines known as race horse machines and pin ball machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all claw machines or similar devices (music boxes and bona fide vending machines excepted) shall be subject to a gross regeipts tax of 5% to be collected by the Comptroller of the State of Maryland, under the provisions of Chapter 601, Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1947; and in addition to said gross receipts tax, said machines shall each be subject to an annual license fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)said license to be issued by the Clerk of the Circuit Court, only after the following conditions have been met by the applicant for licenses and approved by the said County Commissioners.

- 1. Every Applicant for a license shall first satisfy the Board that he is a bona fide resident of the County; ownership of real estate for more than two years or registration as a voter in St. Mary's County shall be conclusive evidence of residence.
- 2. Before any license shall be issued the applicant shall apply under oathto said Board of County Commissioners in writing, on a form to be supplied bysaid Board, stating his or her name and address, date of registration as a voter, and location and description of real estate owned, the number of machines, with the serial number of each of said machines, and location at which machine is to be operated.
- 3. The applicant shall further state under oath that no person, firm or corzoration not a resident of St. Mary's County, will share either directly or indirectly in the proceeds or profits of any machine so designated and licensed.
- 4. Before any license is issued the applicant shall agree with the said Board in the application as follows- that he will report monthly tosaid Board the amount of gross receipts tax paid to the State Comptroller under the provisions of this Resolution that he will not willful or knowingly allow children under the age of 16 years to play any of said machines and that no unlicensed machines will be kept on the premises, and that for violation of any of the above covenants the Board may revoke or suspend the license and retain the license fee paid.
- 5 The application for siad license shall be signed and sworn to by the

owner of the machine and the proprietor of the premises where said machines or machines, are to be located and operated.

6. When the Board is satisfied that said conditions have been met, a certificate will be issued to the clerk of the Circuit Court, authorizing the issuance of said license.

7 The license so issued shall run from May 1st to May first next, at an annual fee of \$50.00 per machine, but an application approved by said Board prior to May1st,1948, a license shall be issued expiring May 1st, 1948, upon the payment of the sum of \$16.66 per machine.

- 8. The Clerk of the Circuit Court is hereby authorized ,after the approval of said Board, upon payment of the fee as aforesaid to issue said license subject to the conditions herein imposed and issue a tag to be displayed on each machine, with words printed or engraved thereon" LICENSED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. MARY'S COUNTY. EXPIRES MAY 1, 1943 or other appropriate year.
- 9. It is understood that all provisions of this Resolution relative to the collection of Gross Receipts Tax of 5% shall not apply to the Town of Leonardtown, Maryland.





This meeting was requested by Rep. Dliver Ruyther who headed a delegation composed of the members of the recently formed St. Mary's Educational Planning Committee, the personnel of which- representing each district pf the County- comprised Mrs. Louis Abell, St. Inigoes; Geo. R. Quirk, Park Hall; Zach Fowler, Chaptico; Mrs. Compton Swann, Tall Timbers; Mrs. Wm. Dixon, Sand Gates; Lawtence Henderson, St. Geo. Island; R.B. Broun, Jr., Leonardtown; Wm. H. Mattingly, Abell; Julian Mears (c) Jarboesville, the other member of the committee was not present.

Miss Lettie M. Dent, Supt of Pub. Schools was also present.

Mr. Guyther, in presenting the program (Building and Repairs) of Pub. Schools in the County said in substance:-

This is a 10 yr building program, to be finaced over a period of 25 years. It calls for the elimination of 1 and 2 room schools to be replaced with Consolidated mmm Elementary Schools at Mechanicsville, thereby savinf cost of transportation and repairs. There are 29 buildings, 1 and 2 rooms, 15 white and 14 colored, 3 brick and 26 frame. The present population of the County is 31,000 four years ago it was 14,000. Pupulation will remain static for the n4dt 4 years. Quoted the Sherbow Act-Incentive Fund, State will give four times the mount the County raises. If this program is adopted it will bring St. Mary's County up to date.

PROGRAM

Margaret Brent High School- 300 pupil capacity in 1950 will be 350- proposes 4 new class rooms, shop, cafeteria etc. cost \$90,000.00

Great Mills High School 6 new class rooms, gym, auditorium Remove frame bldg now in front of brick structure \$139,000.00

Ridge 1 room school 45 pupils renovation \$10,000.00 building additionl room, heat, light indoor toilets

St. Geo. Island, to be abandoned and children transported to Valley Lee. Valley Lee has no school at present, new

one to be constructed, in the meantime electrify St. Geo. Islane and use until new school is ready.

Frank Knox. Agreement with Navy for use until Navy capacity is reached, then not available to outside children.

Great Mills Elementary to be reopened, repaired add cafeteria, 2 toilets cost . \$36,000 (school has been closed several years.)

River Springs Elementary renovate \$1,000.00.

Clements, in good condition, add heat, water and toilets 66-70 pupils \$1,000.00

Committee asked Commissioners to approve expenditure of \$904,000.00 for carrying out this program. For immediate use of \$200,000, and for additional \$704,000 after passage of Enabling Act.

Carver Hts dormitory to replace Jarboesville High colored Miss Dent informed that the building might be secured for \$3,500 and will require about \$8,000 for remodelling for school use. Letters to FPHA and Con. Sascer on this matter dictated and signed by JHTBriscoe, sent copies of same to Miss Dent.

Mr. Briscoe announced that Commissioners agree upon submission of referendum for amounts necessary. It was urged that the amount of \$200,000 necessary for erection of Consolidated School at Mechanics ville be approved by the Board NOW. Mr. Frank Bailey favored this but Capt. M.R.Bailey and J.F. Raley favor submitting referendum on any bond issue.

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The Board of County Commissioners met on Tuesday May 11, 1948 at 10 a.m., all members present.

The first matter to receive attention was a meeting with the citizens of the county, in the interest of the County Public School Program. Due to the attendance the meeting was held in the Court Room, where Capt. M.R. Pailey, president of the Board, presided. Rep. Oliver Guyther, permanent chairman of the St. Mary's County Educational Planning Committee was their spokesman. He gave a short resume of the activities of the group from the time of their organization some three weeks previous, of a committee meeting with the County Commissioners on Saturday way 9th, and their object in the mass meeting of today. The Planning Committee recomended the bonding of the County for \$704,000.00; it also recommended the sum of \$20,000.00 for the renovation of schools now standing in the county and the sum of \$200,000.00 for the erection of a new consolidates elementary school at mechanics ville on ground purchased by the recently retiring Board of Commissioners; the sum of \$704,000.00 to be expended over for a period of 10 years, and to be repaid in He companred the bonded indebtedness of the county 25 years. to a life insurance policy; pay the premium yearly at the end of a specified time you have the policy paid up- at the end of the 25 years the bonds would have been paid and in the interim both pupils and teachers would have enjoyed the use of modern schools.

Mr. Brown was first called upon, by rep. Guyther. He spoke of the recent installation of a heating system in the court room at the expense of \$10,000 for whih the Commissioners had not been critized (The heating system is in the entire Court House and the County Building, some 20 odd rooms). Mr. Broun felt that the Commissioners would likewise not be critized for the bonding of the county to the extent desired by the S.M.C.E.P.C.. Broun called to mind Gov. Crothers who had gone down in memory of Marylander's as the "father of good roads" and said the Commissioners would also be knon to posterity as the "fathers of good schools" if they followed the S.M.C.E.P.C. program. Others called upon to speak in favor of the program were Messrs. Wm.M.Dean, Jos. A. "attingly, Bernard Duke, "r. Gleider, Sen. Paul J. Pailey, Maj. Purgee and the Misses Marriet Reeder and Maud Jarboe. The latter remarked that she was a pupil in the same building where for the past 50 years she had taught, and the same outmo ed method or heating etc., was in vogue now as then, more than 50 years ago. She assists in cleaning out the stove in the morning etc.

In his closing remarks Mr. Guyther advised "the S.M.C.E.P.C. feels it has accomplished its purpose in conveying the senti-

ments of the people of the county. Having accomplished our purpose we would like to rest our case. Build schools as good as others have."

Mr. J.H.T. Priscoe, attorney for the Board spoke on behalf of that body. ne assured the Committee that the Board of County Commissioners would give full consideration to what had been said; that they could not deal lightly with the spending of so stupendous sum as the amount asked for school improvement, details of which had previously been submitted; that the Board would give every consideration to all contemplated improvements; of the \$ \$200,00 bond, of the \$20,000 fund and of the \$704,000.00 program for school construction. ne further stated "the Commissioners are heartily in accord with the idea submitted that a vote of the people thru the medium of an Act to be presented at the coming Special Session- will without doubt give the County Commissioners a mandate, and the Commissioners will entir ly follow the mandate of the people. The only question paramount not is the expenditure of \$200,000 in the near future. Board has every desire to protect the need of the Jounty's children with proper facilities and proper advantages. To the best of their knowledge and ability they will try to do the best thing for the people of the c unty at large, and the children atteding schools."

Mr. J. Claude Johnson, pres. Bd. of Education of St. Hary's County spoke next. The said in part he felt a school at Carver Hts for the colored children would give them a break. (The building in question has been valued as it now stands for \$200,000) ... For the white children an Elementary Consolidated School at echanicsgille to take care of the children from the 4th, 5th and 6th Districts is necessary. Last fall the Bd. of Education visited the schools in the 5th District and found them in a deplorable condition. Rather than spend money in repairing them build a new consolidated school at mechanicsville. When that was accomplished he felt chere would be no waste of money involved, but a good sound program.

The consensus of opinion seemed to be the Consolidated Elementary at Mechanicsville and the remodelled dormitory at Carver Hts.

Mr. Guyther added he had remarked on Miss Jarboe's teaching for 50 years. He called to mind that Miss Dent worked sometimes 16-2) hours a day on the school problems of the county. If the program went thru it would be a tribute to Miss Dent. She replied if the program went thru it would be a tribute to the children of the future. The meeting disbursed at 11 a.m.

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SPECIAL MEETING

At a special meeting held December 4, 1948, a Resolution from the Lions' Cl b of Leonardtown, was presented and read by Mr. R.E.Wigginton, chairman of the Standing Committee on Sanitation, together with a copy of his report to the club Resolution and letters, reports, hereto attached.

A general discussion of the unsanitary conditions existing in the county followed, with the result that the Board requested their attorney, Mr.J.H.T.Briscoe to write a letter to Dr. Geo.R. Waters, State Deputy Health Officer for St. Mary's County, directing him to immediately effect corrections of the more flagrant violations, which are menaces to the health and sanitation of the county.

Referring to Dtr. Waters' request for additional Rules and Regulations relative to sanitation etc., for the County, the consensus of opinion was that there are already on the Statutes sufficient Rules and Regulations for these conditions, what is necessary is their enforcement.

Mr. Briscoe read from the Minutes of June 22, when Dr. Waters and others were present, at which time Dr. Waters was assured of the support of the Board in matters pertaining to the sanitation of the county. Dr. Waters requested that ordinances necessary to cope with the situation be prepared by the Board, in order to enable the Health Dept., to properly function. The Bd. suggested that in view of the present existing laws they were sufficient for the work necessary. They auggested that any additional ordinances Dr. Waters felt were necessary should be prepared by him, and presented to their attorney Mr. Briscoe who would examine them and such as were deemed necessary would be drafted in proper form for the health officers to function and thus clean up any situation existing. It was the latter part of November before Dr. Waters presented anything to Mr. Briscoe, and then it gave him copy of an ordinance of Pr. Geo. Co., and another from Cumberland relating to eating and drinking places, only. These ordinances are, says Mr. Briscoe, another thought, as the matter in question at present is sanitation, plumbing etc.

Capt. M.R.Bailey reiterated that the Board has already assured the Health Department of their willingness to cooperate with them at all times. Mr. Frank Bailey stated he felt that the matter could have been handled in a different matter without so much unfavorable publicity to the County.

Mr. Wigginton advised the Lions' Club felt the Board could not have taken any other stand. A letter was given to Mr. Wigginton by Dr. Waters with the suggestion that he not make same public. At the same time the letter was published in the So.Md. Times of Nov.25,1948, copy of which is filed here. Dr. Waters also volunteeree to give Mr. Wigginton a mimeographer copy of the Ordinances he desired, but which he failed to do.

Mr. King then asked if the letter to the Chrmn of the Std. Com. on San. was considered as a request for the recommendation of Ordinances covering Food-Water-etc., and \$6,000.00 for the transportation and salary of 2 additional Sanitation Officers.

Mr. Wigginton replied he felt that the report his committee made covered all those items.

While the Ordinances which Dr. Waters gave Mr. Briscoe covered only food and drink, Dr. Waters never mentioned that he required Ordinances for special items, but general. Briscoe says he does not propose to sit down and draw up a If the Health lot of ordinances needed by the Health Dept. Dept. advises what the need specifically he feels confident the Bd. will have them prepared and approved. However, all feel that the Ordinabces exisiting on the Statutes seem ample Mr. Briscoe then produced transcripts for all conditions. of records from the Tr. Mag. Court Feb 18,1944 wherein Chas. J. Mattingly, the then Sanitation officer for St. Mary's made a cimplaint against one W.E.Fletcher, tavern keeper of Great Mills, charging him with selling food and beverages in an unclean place, after being duly notified in writing that he was not to do so until his premises had been cleaned and passed inspection. Mr. Fletcher posted bondaoft\$30000 each of 2 counts, which he forfeited by failing to appear. Another case was that of Bat however, clean up his place. Russell, charged with removing oysters from a polluted area. Dr. E.C. Peck, the late Health Officer for This he denied. St. Mary's County brought into court moving picture film and When the picture was flashed on the screen in his surprise, the defendant cried out "why that's me." film showed the defendant in the very act which he denied. Mr. Briscoe further remarked that the State Health Dept., had evidently changed its' policy, since Dr. Feck did not hesitate to bring violators of the Rules and Regulations pertaining to the Health and Sanitation of the county before the Dr. Waters had previously stated that the State Dept. of Health preferred not to make charges as they might interfere with his clinics, and prefers the County officials to do this.

The Board insists the point is to enforce the rules and regulations now on the statutes which coverm foody drink, plumbing etc. Mr. Brische says that after duly notifying the offenders in writing if conditions are rectified, a warrant charging them with the violation should be served. He feels if the present Health officers followed the Rules and Regulations and secured such warrants, they would soon clear up the situation.

The Board feels it is entirely unnecessary to appropriate \$6,000 for the transportation and salaray of two additional sanitation officers, since the present one apparently does not do his work.

Mr. Smith called attention to the fact that cases of Scarlet Fever existed in a family where four children were of school age. The attending physician reported the matter to Dr. Waters himself, requesting that the family be quarantined.

This Dr. Waters refused to do. The result is that there are now 6 cases of scarlet fever in the county. The responsibility of quaranting rests entirely with the Health Dept.

Mr. Jackson stated that the Health Dept. is keeping close touch with the dairies in Leonardtown, and other places. However, the Amish sell milk, without having their cattle tested, their barns inspected or a permit to do so.

Mr. Wigginton stressed the fact that the Lions' report is not against any individual or section in particular, but rather the county in general.

Mr. Briscoe then advised that the Rules and Regulations regarding imspection of Building and Plumbing are under the Health Dept. statutes.

As a result of the meeting the Board has gone into the matter of the urgent needs of the county, requesting Mr. Briscoe to prepare a letter addressed to Dr. Waters directing him to enforce all laws now on the statutes relating to the health and sanitation of the county. After he has made a complete survey of such rules etc., Mr. Briscoe will draft the letter and copy will be sent to Dr. Riley. Letter will be ready Dec. 7.

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After the above matters were settled Mr. B.I.Smith appeared relative to a heat control for the thermostat. He suggested that such control could be installed, with time clock for raising and lowering temp in Court House- rather than the constant changing of the thermostat. He also advised that due to the increased number of lights now used in the various offices, the present wiring system is inadequate and dangerous. He proposed to furnish and install

1 automatic thermostat heat control with time clock 35 floor plugs in the several rooms, where desired Rewire Ct. House with new system

all of the above not to exceed \$500.00 He was instructed to commence the work at once. Proposal was accepted by Capt. M.R. Bailey.

At eleven o'clock the Bd. of Education of St. Mary's Co., Mr. Craude Johnson, Pres., Mrs. Maude Gardiner, Mr. Geo. Thomas and Miss Dent appeared relative to Building Program. Asked for 2 projects

l Carver Heights - remodelled-/hearly completed now (c)

2 Consolidated Elementary in 5th Dist.

County Commissione Is voted unanimously to startd on the two above projects. In Sept. Bd. purchased Carver Hts. dormitory for use as colored school in that section, in place of old Jarboesville School. \$10,000 was allocated for remodelling but Miss Dent now advises cost will exceed that, but not too much. Mr. Briscoe advises additional cost can be taken from Incentive Fund.

First project for consideration under the new Bond Issue is the tonsolidated at Mechanicsville.

Mr. Baldwin has already prepared tentative plans for Mech. Consol. and received \$60.00 for work which was not completed. His services will be retained in this project and \$1.00.00 will be deducted from final charge.

Great Mills Elementary, scheduled to be purchased from Incentive Fund, cannot be purchased that way, so Mr. Briscoe advises. Purchase price must be raised from funds other than Inc F. At time of Election Incentive Funds were set aside, according to Mr. Briscoe's interprepation, to pay for Sinking Fund and interest.

Mr. Briscoe suggests that Bd. of Educa. present tentative plans for school, number and size of rooms, gym. all-purpose room, cafeteria, etc., this information will be of great assistance to County Commissioners and their Planning and Reviewing Board.

For Publication, Mr. Briscoe advised Miss Dent she could state that Bd. Educa and Bd. Co.Com met in fonference on School Bldg program, which had been submitted with 2 projects - Carver Hts for colored project, and Elem. Consol. at Mech for white. Owing to absence of Mr. Frank Bailey nothing definite was settled, but matter taken into consideration.

Miss Dent reported that her office has detailed information in re each public school in the county, available for use by the Co. Commissioners. She also requested permission to use \$300 from Incentive Fund for purchase of metal bldg for use at Bannaker, Mr. Briscoe advises this cannot be done.

Mr. M.M.Dean asked why nothing had been done and Mr. Briscoe called his attention to the two above projects Mr. Dean then said a law was passed in Chas. County at about the same time the law passed in St. Mary's relative to bonding for schools and schools in Chas. County were almost ready for use, but nothing had been done here. Mr. Briscoe replied that the Chas. County law stipulated certain schools to be built on specified sites for definite amounts, whereas the school program in St. Mary's was left to the discretion of the Bd. of Commissioners. Said Mr. Dean "do you say the bill was worded wrong?" Mr. Briscoe replied "I do not say so." Mr. Briscoe repeated several times throughout the discussion that the Bd. of Commissioners would consider all projects presented to them by the Bd. of Education but would not do anything until definite and specific projects were received. Briscoe added that if the Council felt that other schools should be built in the County other than those specified by the Bd. of Educa, the Council and the Bd. of Educa should get together on the matter and reach a decision. Asked how long it would take to secure the money for the school building program, Mr. Briscoe replied that when the projects were presented and approved the money would be He further advised the Council that the Commissioners gotten. had appointed an Advisory Board who would receive the specified projects, give them careful consideration and later pass them on to the Commissioners with their recommendations.

Commissioner Frank Bailey said he felt it would be a wise program to build and complete each year, one school for white and one school for colored, rather than start construction of several and not complete any.

It was reported that Mr. C.J.Johnson, president of the Bd. of Educa advised the Council the Commissioners had made no money available to the Bd. Mr. Briscoe replied that the Carver Hts dormitory was paid for, the sum of \$10,000 assured for remodelling of same, and the sum of \$11,200

allocated for repairs as requested May 8,1948. (\$24,700.00) He further stated that the Commissioners intended to first determine what schools were needed, what they would cost before placing any heavy debt on the taxpayers of the County, To bond at once, without definite plans, and to place the interest debt on the people longer than was necessary, would cause great condemnation by the people they represent and whose money will be used to pay the cost. They have no intention of bonding for the full amount and handing the money over without first considering the manner of its being used. He further stated that when the Bd. of Educa presented definite and specific programs they will receive the Commissioners immediate consideration, if and when the county is bonded for the program.

Mr. Oliver Guyther was very anxious to correct a statement attributed to him by the metropolitan daily, which credited him with saying the reason for the delay in the program was due to the Commissioners being politically opposed to him. He said his remarks were rather that there "was a faction opposed to him, politically, which did not mant his faction to receive credit for the building program." He went on to say that "Unless this Bond issue gets underway I WILL PASS A LAW MAKING IT MANDATORY THAT THE COUNTY BE BONDED AS I DO NOT INTEND TO ALLOW THE FIRST LAW TO BACKFIRE."

Last May the Council presented a Long Range Program to the Commissioners. From that list Mr. Guyther suggested the Commissioners could select several projects and start, rather than wait for the Bd. of Educa to present an entirely new program. He added that there were several projects he personally felt were important

Mr. Briscoe replied that the Commissioners would make no such move they wou,d wait for the specified projects to be requested by the Bd. Educa. Should the Commissioners select any project and work on it, it might be one the Bd of Educa considered important therefore they would wait for projects specified by the Bd. of Educa.

When asked what amount he had in mind, \$350,000.00 as voted on or \$550,000.00 as appeared in the conservation, Mr. Guyther replied he meant \$550,000.00 which is just about half of what the Long Range Program needs." When asked if he referred to the \$904,400.00 amount as first requested for the L.R.P. he said "that is right, they (m aning the Council) knew the people of the County would never vote for the bonding of the County to that extent; that was why they had asked for the \$350,000.00 the rest will come later." He said he considered the \$200,000.00 as authorized without vote in 1948 was settled, making the amount available with the bond issue \$550,000.00"

The gist of the meeting was to the effect that when the Bd. of Education present specific and definite requests the Commissioners will consider them.

Shores-Newtown-Medley's Neck to St. Mary's Academy, some children board the bus at 7 a.m. in order to get a seat. Must be attended to promptly. Letter recd. from Mrs. Chaplin and she appeared in person to protest.

- Town Commissioners.

The Town Commissioners of Leonardtpwn appeared relative to requesting Legislative body to draft a bill, changing fees of Slot Machines to \$100 flat, no 5% rates, and amount of each machine installed in Town to be turned over direct to the Commissioners. (State will continue $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% for amusement tax) Mr. Briscoe advised that the Commissioners would agree to turning half of the fee over to the Town, not all.

Zoning Town desires zoning. Mr. Briscoe advised they should consult their clerk who is also an attorney, and have him study the Town laws; feels sure the town can make its own zoning laws. He also suggested they consult Mr. M.C. Thompson, Jr., chairman of the County Zoning Commission who can assist them. The County Commissioners further suggest the Town and County Zone on territory adjacent to each line, so that zoning of either will not interfere.

Afternoon session was taken up by conference with Bd of Educa.

Bd. of Education and Miss Dent appeared and presented a very comprehensive School Program Project. Mr. J.Claude Johnson, read the program, for each county school (public) and the Commissioners considered each plan. They advised that they had selected an Advisory Committee, with a representative from each Election District, a colored representative from each Commissioner Election, several bankers and ladies from different sections of the county. These persons will review the program presented, give every detail their consideration and after extensive study will return the program with their recommendations to the County Commissioners who will then take the necessary steps towards putting a program in action.

Mr. Briscoe expressed the appreciation of the Commissioners for the program which is the first constructive step necessary. The Commissioners feel it is the duty of the Bd. of Educa to look after the school needs of the county. He stated he feels the program presented requires a good deal of study.

Mr. J.Claude Johnson, agreed that the program outlined above could be made public, but advised that the figures appearing were merely approximates, not definite prices.

Mr. Frank Bailey said Mech School was the first project, as he considered Carver Hts. was settled and the balance of that work was in the hands of the Bd. of Educa. Mr. Briscoe advised that Mr. Baldwin had presented tentative plans, part of fee had been paid and Bd. Educa should present a complete picture of what they felt was needed there. Feels this requires a lot of study.

Mr. Briscoe feels that while Carver Hts may not be perfectly planned for school use, it was a great saving to the County and could be remodelled to good advantage. Miss Dent advised that altho the ground around the school is not over 1 A, the Commandant of the NATC, Patuexnt River Base had agreed to let the pupils use ball diamond, playground etc., on the reservation near the school. She also feels that when Jarboesville school is abandoned the Navy may want to make a deal concerning it.

Miss Dent == read from the Beacon of Jan 28, relative to lack of report of repairs made, as requested in May etc. Article is attached hereto. Also stated that some of the repairs requested were not made, as she felt they were not advisable and requested permission to use that money otherwise, than on the schools designated. Mr. Briscoe should clarify this matter at next meeting.

Discussion relative to school on St. Geo Island came up. Mr. Bailey feels it would be most unwise to build a school for those pupils elsewhere than on the island. He feels it would necessitate bus travel across the bridge four times and and that would be dangerous. Also that on the island no bus is necessary. Matter of widening road came up for discussion and Mr. Bailey said he had travelled all over the section in question and the road would be widened at the corner not close to the church, school or graveyard. Bd. Educa also recommended continuing the school on St. Geo. Isla. (see the original program May 8-)

Mr. W.B.Duke and Mr. Feorge quirk, representing the St. Mary's County Council PTA were present. Mr. Duke desired to review all former conferences with his organization and the Bd. Educa and the Commissioners. Mr. Briscoe said he felt Mr. Duke was merely attempting to cloud the issue each time he appeared. Capt. Matt Bailey said he would deal with the Bd. of Educa and not the SMCCPTA, and expressed himself rather forcefully about their interference in the matter.

- Degislation enabling license fees on coin operated machines to be taxed increased to a sum not to exceed \$100 per mamma machine, also reasonable provision as to distributor's licenses, and eliminating entirely the gross receipts ta It is considered that the form of tax indicated would be the fairest and best under the circumstances. Quere, would the fact that this law was passed with refereudum attached have any bearing upon questions as to change other than by a referendum? In the event of the change in the law, provision should also be made for an equal division of license fees of all machines within the corporate limits of Leonardtown, between the town and the Coun ty.
- 11. Consideration should also be given as to better control of subdivisions, with especial refrence to sanitation problems. If present law is amply on subject no legislation is needed.

"Leonardtown, Md. Feb. 14th, 1949

The County Commissioners of St. Mary's County desire to make the following statement as to the present status of the School Construction Program.

At the regular meeting of the Commissioners on December 28th,1948 the Board of Education presented a request for funds for the construxtion of a consolidated school fpr white children to be constructed on the site already purchased for that purpose near Mech. At this meeting announcement was made by the Commissioners that the first step in connection with proposed project was the clearing up of the question of the architect for same, it being understood that Mr. James J. Baldwin had previously drawn some preliminary plans and had received a payment on account of fees for same. In order to clear up this question, Mr. Baldwin was requested to appear before the Commissioners, which he did on January 25th, and as a result of a conference with Mr. Baldwin on this date, and subsequent conference between Messrs. Baldwin, A.F.King, clerk and John H.T.Briscoe, atty to the Board, it can now be announced that Mr. Baldwin has been approved as architect for this project, if and when same is approved, amounts already paid Mr. Baldwin to be credited on total fees for job

At the regular meeting of the Commissioners on Feb. 8,1949 the Bd. of Education submitted a building program, a copy of which is sent with this letter. The Bd. of Educa was advised that these projects would receive careful consideration by the Commissioners.

At the same meeting, Mr. J. Claude Johnson, president of the Bd. of Educa. stated that the Carver Hts dormitory Bldg when remodelled, would take care of the colored pupils in the Immunambourn lower end of the County, it being contemplated that the following schools, to wit Jarboesville Elemen. They do not intend, in so far as is possible, to take any hasty or ill advised action relative to carrying out this program, at the same time pledging prompt consideration and of the program as outlined and prompt decision relative thereto.

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Regular meeting held Wednesday February 23, 1949 all members present.

Request of W.O.Bennett to transfer slot machine on his premises to those of R. Taylor on 3 Notch Rd, granted.

Advis. Bd. to meet with them on this morning, all repaired to the office of the Tr. Magistrate. Mr. Briscoe conducted the meeting and explained that its purpose was to assist the Commissioners in the very important problem of working out the School Bldg. program. Members of the Advis. Bd., ladies and gentlemenwhite and colored had been selected from the various sections of the county to consider the program from every angle, and to make recommendations to the Bd. They desired to secure help from the very best brains in the county, and carefully selected the Ad. Bd. with a view to having a representative group, and they expected a lot of help from them.

In May 1948 the St. Mary's Educa. Planning Com. presented a School Program to the Commissioners, which called for nearly one million dollars. On this program the Commissioners did not act. Enabling Acts had been passed by the Legislature- one in 1947 authotirzing the Comm. to borrow \$200,000.00, the other in 1948 (by referendum) authorizing them to borrow \$350,000.00 at not exceeding 3%, periannum- making a total of \$550,000.00 which could be borrowed for the School program use. On Feb 8, 1949 the Bd. of Educa. of St. Mary's Co., presented a definite program, the first the Comm. had received from them, which in its entirety called for the expenditure of \$630,000.00. It was quite obvious that the entire program could not be carried out, therefore, it would be the work of the Advs. Bd. to select from that program those projects which they considered the most important, and after considering them from every point-location, size, etc., they were to present their findings with recommendations to the Comm. who would then consider what action should be taken. of raising money to defray the cost of school building would be by bonds, etc., which money could also be used to pay for remodelling, refurnishing etc., schols now in use.

Interest and Sinking Fund were to come from the Incentive Fund which is raised by Levy. The County is allowed to set aside as much as 5¢ on each \$1.00 of taxes for the Incentive Fund, (and the County has always set aside that amt) the State then matches it with so much per pupil in Pub. Schs- about 4 times as much as the County levies, and it is called the Incentive Fund to encourage the counties. Miss Dent remarked that the creation of the Incentive Fund was the first step of the State to put money into school construction. The 1947 Incentive Fund was used to purchase Caryer Hts. Dormitory \$3,500.00 and remodelling of same was allocated \$10,000.00. However, should more be necessary for that work it would be forthcoming. Thus Carver Hts. is one proof the Bd. need not consider. Estimated amt from Incentive Turne 1949

is \$9,990.00 and for 1950 is \$25,000.00 This money can only be used for Debt Service on the bonds, if and when they are issued.

Mr. Briscoe suggested the Advs. Bd.organize, elect chairman, secretary etc. and proceed along the lines they deem best. After a lieighthy and deliberate study of the Sth. Bldg Pro. they are to make a detailed report to the Comm. The services of Mr. Briscoe in a legal capacity, and of A.F.King in clerical capacity, were offered to the Ad. Bd. Miss Dent also offered all the material in her fiels relative to the Pro to which the Ad. Bd. was welcome should they desire to use same. in order to reach best conclusions. When Mr. Broun asked if the purpose of the Ad. Bd. was to aid the Comm. in allocating funds, he was told it was. Mr. Burch was then advised that the present estimate of the Incentive Fund was based on the taxable basis for 1949- \$15,000,000.00. Mr. Broun ten remarked that \$350,000.00 at 2½% could be retired in 14 yrs. and the int. cost of \$78,750.00 would make the total cost of that amt. reach \$428,750.00.

Miss Dent advised that unless some buildings were initiated by 1951 the increase in pupils would necessitate holding school in 2 sessions which is now being done in some counties in the state. She advised the Feb 1949 Sch. Bldg. Fro. was the outgrowth of very careful study on the part of the Bd. of Educa and could not meet the entire needs of the county, but they were listed in order of priority the Bd. of Educa feels the schools should receive.

The Comm. then retired to their offices and the Adv. Bd. elected Mr. R.B.Broun, Jr., chairman (at his request Mrs. A.F.King was made secretary) and 3 members were appointed as the Exec. Comm. Mrs. Howard Chesser, St. Geo. Isl; Mr. Zach Fowler, Chaptico and Mr. F. Elliott Burch, Charlotte Hall- one from either end and the center of the county. This Comm. will study the program, meet with the full Advs. Bd. to present their findings, and later the recommendations of the entire Advs. Bd will be presented to the Comm.

Afternoon session was spent with the Electrical Bd. and complainants Allan Dameron, Lloyd Brown and Riley Fletcher.

Mr. Prown says that Oct 1946 he applied for renewal license but same was never granted. He was a former member of the Elec. Bd. but resigned. Mr. Smith said Brown resigned his license as he was working on the Naval Base, but Mr. Br. said ne he didnt. Mr. Chas. Moore- also of the Elec. Bd- said he understood Mr. Brown desired to clear up all his wiring as he, Br. felt no one in the county should have outside license. They asked if the Naval Base was in the County and Mr. Priscoe said it was not. Then they asked is Lex. Pk in the Naval Base and Mr. Priscoe said it is.

Mr. Smith said there was some contention as to the boys working on the base having a license and wiring on Sundays and holidays, and ti was decided to cancel such licenses. Mr. Wm.E.Sterling said it could not be done without a Court Order, and the matter was dropped at that time. Mr. Brown said those in the electrical trade didnt make much, and the cost of living was so high they had to do other jobs in order that their families might have some fo the things they were entitled to... He said electricians usual y have other things to do, such assheating, plumbing etc. He said he maintained a place of business and his wife is his clerk.

changed his address, didnt notify the Elec. Bd of change because he didnt want to. (Very independent attitude all thru hearing, inclined to be impudent, too.) Mr. Briscpe said Mr. Fletcher should also take the exam on April 1st and follow the others in the matter of appealing if he is not satisfied with results of his exam.

Chas. J. Mattingly said his son-in-law Robt. Brown had made application in Dec and not been notified of date of exam, Mr. Smith said applications had to be in 30 days before exams and the application was recd. Mr. Briscoe said he felt the blame for the mix-up was due to laxity on part of both Bd of Elec Spv and complainants. His instructions were to "follow the rules and regulations and appeal to the Bd of Arbitration if not satisfied with their marks."

Discussion lasted 2½ hours. due to complainants who repeated same questions so many times

Gentlemen:

This Board of Education, having made a County-wide study of the Public School Building needs in St. Mary's County, hereby requests your attention and immediate action in initiating the financing of a Building Program to meet the needs listed on the attached sheet.

Our request is made following a detailed study of information afforded by conference with the County Superintendent of Schools, by consideration of information gleaned from the recent School Survey by Dr. Clarence Newell, and by our personal visits to practically every school site in St. Mary's County. We are convinced that our needs are very urgent, and that the general building situation in St. Mary's is probably the worst in the State.

In estimating the number of class rooms needed for each proposed unit, the Board of Education is mindful of the Law effective July 1, 1951 which stipulates "Whenever an elementary school numbers more than thirty (30) children in average enrollment an assistant may be employed and for every additional thirty (30) children one teacher shall be appointed".

With these facts in mind, we unanimously recommend that the Commissioners take action on financing a Building Program and that the projects be initiated in the order in which we list them, as per attached sheets.







Board met at 2 p.m. as Zoning Board to hear the matter of the Merchants of Lexington and Patuxent Park, vs. Blaine Short in the rezoning of "B" residential to "C" commercial, dormitories.

Copy of transcript filed in files under Zoning.

Synopsis of above is as follows:-

Wo.E.Sterling, attorney for merchants Arthur Rysticken attorney for Blaine Short.

Property in question is dormitories located on Coral Dr. and Tulagi Pl., to be rezoned "C" and remodelled into hotel with accommodations for 75, semi-private baths; theatre, small stores- barben, beauty florist shops etc.

Nearest parties to above property are Navy and "C" commercial.

Persons interviewed, Hiram Millison, merchant; Jack Rue, tavern keeper Robt. Wigginton, co-owner of movie theatre; Pex. Pk Methodist Church sent letter., and Mr. Blaine Short.

Mr. Millison feels that there are already enough stores located in this area, also he proposes to erect 13 more; that traffic is congested; parking not sufficient; housing conditions bad. Therefore, property should be retained as "B" residential and no additional stores built by Mr. Short.

Mr. Rue feels that enough stores already in that area; should be retained as "B" residential

Mr. Wigginton feels that as his theatre is seldom filled to capacity another theatre is not necessary, but housing conditions being bad property should be retained zoned "B"

Mr. T.W.Nicolet interviewed; feels additional stores and rezoning to "C" would be advantageous to county, and that area

Methodist Church in letter of protest feels that church should not be located in "C" and rezoning would be detrimental to church property. (Church did not take out Bldg permit, and when purchased knew that they were in commercial area. Failed to compy with County laws.)

Mr. Short said that since he acquired property late Dec 48, about 68% of rooms in dormitories were vacant, altho he had raised rent \$5 per mo, he could still accommodate all applicants. Produced two letters from Commanding Officer of Naval Basem who is heartily in accord with proposed plan for remodelling as hotel such as Mr. Short plans would be advantageous to technicians and other citizens who have business with Navy and Navy has no accommodations for them, must house them in BOQ, against Navy regulations.

It was brought to light that the Navy plans to erect 200 houses, to rent at \$1+0 per month, for use of sailors and tyeir families. Also, that bids are being asked for additional homes to be erected in that area by the Navy.

In summing up, Mr. Rysticken said fundamental concept of our democracy is the property right. Zoning unconditionally limits these rights. Zoning is accepted for Police power, for the public good, public safety, welfare and morals of a community. Under the law the Zoning Board has no right to say 'we need houses you cannot build a hotel'. The testimony given at this hearing was not consistant. Mr. Millison stated they had a large enough shopping or business area already established, yet he plans to erect 13 more stores. Mr. Short's proposed plan will be an addition not a detriment to the admunity. The property has really been zoned "C" and he has a right to use it as such. The Navy would be the only valid objectors, yet they heartily approve. Requests Bd. approve.

Mr. Sterling remarked that "county is only zoned in sections most thickly populated where zoning is needed. Needs of the community and people in general must be considered. Sufficient land is already zoned "C" and there exists a housing shortage. Navy plans to take the public money and erect homes for enlisted men and their families. People now residing in dormitories are not eligible for Navy housing. Property not well to be changed when so much is already zoned "C" Requests Board reject the proposal.







Gasparovic plans to erect on the site-were already under construction near the gate of the NATC. Mr. Gasprovic was the original applicant for Bowl. A Smith and Seidman did not apply until Oct 18

In an executive session the Board agreed unanimously that the site should be "rezoned "commercial" in view of the facts 1-part of the area in question is already "commercial" 2-Mr. Gasparovic has been a substantial taxpayer for over 34 yrs.

3- An additional Bowling Alleys and Recreation Hall would not be too much for that area as there are so many residents there, and also so many of the onlisted personnel at the MATC.

Nov 8 the Pub Hearing, (properly advertished in the 2 County papers) was held, with only one signer of the protest appearing. Movember 22, 1949

The Board of Commissioners met today, with all members present.

First matter considered was

Roads

Rev. Horace Mukenna, S.J., with delegation Geo. Thompson, Harry Chesley and others requesting improvement in 1 mi of road between Dameron and Beachville. Seven families live on this road and have no way to travel, except by foot, when weather is bad.

2nd request was for improvement on the road at Ridge- 14 mi impassable in bad weather, except by foot or horse.

Mr. Richley Brown requests that <u>road</u> on which work was started several weeks ago be made passable before bad eather sets in. Road is used by school bus and bus driver was instructed not to use same when road is bad. Road needs to be shaped up, drained and gravelled. Mr. Thompson was present later, and was instructed as to this matter. He will get to work on the remainder of the road within few days. Clerk instructed to write Mr. Thompson of the Board's decision.

• • Joseph A. Mattingly stated the organizations settled on a Memorial — library because it would be a memorial for the dead and a source of pleasure and benefit to the County. This would be a memorial for World War II and all veterans, and since no outward sign of respect has been paid to those who did serve, it might be well if this request were granted."

Roland Duke said the memorial is valuable, close to his heart. Out of the '30 boys from the County who did not come back, one was his son. He was also president of the St. Mary's Reading Room and Debating Society and his heart is in this project. He said he could see no reason for going to a referendum for 2/5 of a cent This Board has the priviledge of setting the rate for 5 or 10¢ more. Adding that amount would not raise the taxes too much. He said for so long this County was at the tail end of everything and now it has a chance and he would like to see it get away from that position. Mr. Frank Bailey said the County is still at the end in a number of things.

Mr. Sterling who was acting atty for the Board remarked that he had represented the Am. Legion Post 54, he recalled quite well when this matter came up before the BRost, the entire Post went whole heartedly for the Library Memorial and so far as he knows it hasnt changed its feeling.

Mr. Frank Bailey stated the Bd didnt know what it would take to run the Library. Mrs. Davidson replied that the library association had had a hard time. She is willing to make up any deficiency for a year or so. She is doing the building over at her own expense and at the end of 3 years if it isnt in working order she will take it back.

Mr. LaBat said "Is there anyone here who could tell us a reason not to have a Public Library?" Mr. Frank Ba ley replied "We dont know wny." anyone should have a reason for being against it. We are all in favor of it, but we will wait to let the people decide if they want it."

Mr. LaBat said "you state you feel you cant deny the Old age pension, can you sit there and deny your children and my children books to read and the availability of the library. If you cant see denying Old Age pensions I cant see how you can deny us the library."

Mr. F. Bailey said "if a man is hungry and begging and in need, dont you think that is different? Do you think what you put in your head from a book will fill you here (stomach) when you are empty? You ask for \$2000 for a library and the County Welfare asks for \$4000 for the poor. We wont agree to the library. "All members of the Board agreed to this. Mr. Bailey said if he had the money to give for the library and he would be the one to get the blame for it, he would give the money. People would be down on the Board for such a decision. 1500 names dont represent the entire county."

2 • ^

The Board met today for Public Hearing on the Proposed Budget for 1950. All members were present. In the absence of Atty. J.H.T.Briscoe- who is in Charles County as State's Attorney- W.O.E.Sterling acted as attorney.

About thirty citizens attended the hearing.

The most important question appeared to be the fact that no provision was made for a Public Library fund, which would have been \$.002 on each tax \$1.00. The Board had expressed their intention to having this question answered by referendum at the election in 1950 and would make no provision until then. When advised they had received petitions signed by over 1500 taxpayers, the Board replied that that number did not represent the majority of taxpayers in the County. Mrs. Howard Davidson, Mrs. Fernando Cuniberti, Mr. Stuart LaBat, Mrs. LaBat, sr., Mr. Elliott E. Burch, R. B. Duke, Oliver Guyther and J.A. Mattingly spoke in favor of the Library, especially is it important to many because it is a world war memorial, as well as a source of information and pleasure. The Commissioners remained firm in their decision to have the vote of the people on the matter.

Mr. R.B.Duke advised he understood two of the County's volunteer fire departments were not being cared for in the Budget. On examination it appears that the five volunteer organizations of the County are on the Budget.

Oliver Guyther questioned the amount asked by Welfare for it's 1950 allowance. He pointed out that in 1946 State, Federal and Local funds used for Welfare amounted to over Nine Million dollars, in 1948 they were over thirteen million and for 1950 they would total over seventeen million. Mr. Frank Bailey, who is a member of the St. Mary's County Gelfare Bd., informed that he felt the sum was not too large to assist those When it was brought to his attention that the Welfare in need. allottment could be curtailed and with the curtailment use it as a Library Fund base and thus secure for the people pleasure and culture from reading, he added that when one is hungry the memory of a good story was not very filling. He said a large amount of the money allotted to Welfare was for Old Age Pensions, and as long as he was on the Board he would prefer to use it aid the old, and dependant children of which there are many in the County. He doesn't feel that money used for the poor is being thrown away. He further stated that St. Mary's County would not aid able bodied people, and there was plenty of work they could do eithout receiving funds from Welfare.

Mr. Elliott E. Burch asked whether a representative from the State Unemployment Compensation office came to St. Mary's

and he was advised that such a representative does come twice each month. Mr. Bailey then produced a check which he had received from Welfare for his mileage during the month of October, which totaled \$.98. He explained that members of the Welfare Bd. were selected from a group of names and were appointed for a term of 3 years. Mr. Guyther then stated he was not critical of the Commissioners, he just wondered if it were wise to allot such a large sum for Welfare work.

Capt. M.R. Bailey said he approved the amount requested as did Mr. J. Frank Baley.

Mrs. Howard Davidson, Pres. St. Mary's Mem. Library Asso stated that she had purchased and was doing over Tudor Hall at her own expense and it was hoped the building would be accepted for the Memorial Library. She requested the Board to appropriate the sum of \$.002 per tax \$1.00, and further stated if more money than this taxation would yield, after being matched by the State were needed for the next two years she would personally be responsible for that amount. The Board still refused to reconsider their decision.

Mrs. Davidson informed that they were ready to plaster at Tudor Hall and the water supply had been shut off for some time due to an accident then the public parking lot was installed. The Board has made several efforts to have this remedied, and instructed their secretary to contact Mr. Kenneth B. Duke to have the matter attended to and a bill sent the Board which they will pay. (A letter was written and a telephone call made to Mr. K.B.Duke in this connection and he agreed to have same attended to.)

Mrs. LaBat, Sr., said the County Commissioners were empowered to increase or decrease the Budget and she commended the Bd. for the many improvements in County uildings etc., which it has made. She said the Board had the confidence of the people of the County and she feels they would agree with their decision to levy a tax for the Library and all will stand with the Commissioners. Mr. Frank Bailey said again the Board would do the will of the people.

Mr. Turch mentioned the many organizations represented on the petitions signed and sent to the Board and felt they would all approve the decision of the Bd to levy the tax. He stated that when a meeting was held in connection with the County Libray Mr. K.B.Duke was head of the meeting and all organizations represented were ain accord.

Mr. LaBat said "we have 2000 names who want it, have you 500 who dont?"

Mrs. LaBat said "it is an immediate necessity, why make the County wait for two more years, when they really need it now?"

Mr. Bailey said he had a conscience and he had to clear it, and when he did it made him feel better. Rev. Hildebrand How do you do it it sir?" and Mr. Bailey replied I cannot have the people mad with me for a thing like the library. I feel they must approve it."

It was teh unanimous decision of the entire Board to wait for the referendum.

Debt Service.
Mr. Guyther questioned the amounts in Debt Service.

Bernard Duke said he noted that the Liq. Bd. Inspector was paid \$2400.00, clerk \$1200, stenog \$600. Mr. Sterling who is clerk to the Liq. Bd explained that law required the Liq. Bd. to meet once a month. It meets more often than that and when the need arises they employ a partetime stenog to take the testimony, but the applicant always has the right to take an appeal to the Circuit Court and therefore they need the testimony to present to the Court, so it can see on what grounds the Liq Bd. takes the action it took. The stenog is very necessary and she takes the testimony the same as Mrs. Jackson was taking that today, those was not representing the Board of Commissioners, but Miss Dent.

When asked how the 5½% recd from Slot machine tax was accounted for it was explained that the State Comptroller doesnt send the money in except thru "Admission Tax" Mr. Guyther had phoned Balto on the 28th for the amount paid to St. Mary's County and they had given him the figure \$23,334.00 up to Sept 30- the County Commissioners had no such sum, and the amount received thru Admission Taxes had reached \$16,859.36. A phone call was made direct to the Deputy Comptroller Mr. McCuster who replied that Mr. Guyther had figures from July 48 to Sept 49- whereas the County had received checks from Jan to Oct 49, only. The State Comptroller's office was then requested to make all further payments of this tax in a separate check which they agreed to do. The secretary was instructed to write a letter to Mr. McCuster and make this request.

Bernard Duke asked how the c ntracts were paid on parochial school buses, and he was informed by mileage @ 20¢ per mile, average.

Mr. Guyther said the Cash Balance on hand was \$204,055.00 and taxes could be reduced to 1.22. It was explained that from the Cash on hand the price of Great Mills High School would be taken in the event the amount could not be used from the State School Loan appropriation. This information the County does not have. Also, the taxes are not due and collected until July 1st, and the County has to have a cash balance with which to work until the taxes are collected.

Roads.
The amount of \$2,000 per month allocated to State Roads Com for maintenance for County roads was questioned as all felt the

County roads are in pretty bad shape.

Frequently it was brought to the attention of the Board that they could use some of the cash on hand for the library fund, but their reply was always the same- let the people decid e

Mr. LaBat said in view of what Mr. Guyther had pointed out that the taxes could be reduced at this time, would they consider the Library appropriation at this time? Everyone knows the County is getting plenty of money, everyone knows you can afford the money- we can afford it.

State Roads.
The Board was asked if they felt they were getting their money's worth on the road work being done. Mr. Bailey explained that he had attended a meeting of the State Roads Commission in Annapoli polis, when the Commissioners were asked if they desired to have control of their own roads upkeep and they decided to let the SRC continue, as the SRC had men, and machinery and it would be took big a job for the Commissioners. Since then the Bd had purchased 4 pieces of machinery and he felt it might be well for the Bd to take over the county roads.

Public Health Juaters.

Mrs. Davidson then pointed out that the Health Dept is in miserable quarters and asked if the Bd intended to build a home for them as the County couldnt get a decent health doctor here because they lacked a place fit for them to work. The Bd. said that was in the future.

Bernard Duke said he would like to make a remark before he left. It had been pointed out that taxes could be reduced and also that the Commissioners didnt see fit to give a sum for the library. Since taxes didnt have to be raised couldnt the Bd still give the money for the library which would benefit generations to come. He said he represented the St. Mary's County Teachers' Asso- and was a member of the S.M.C.Civic Asso- they have one thousand paid members -and would like to go on record as asking for the library.

Mr. LaBat asked who the budget wasnt published and Mr. Sterling read Sec 53, Laws of Special Session which provided that only the date and time of Pub Hearing need be published and that at least 3 copies of the proposed Budget must be available in the office of the County Commissioners for anyone to read and discuss. The date of signing the Budget is Dec. 1-1949.

Board adjourned at 1 p.m.

Miss Dent indicated an amount, approximately one million dollars would be required for a long term program, and pointed out that St. Mary's County had never had a bond issue for schools and that the physical properties for school purposes were deplorable. She said she did not advocate a Bond Issue specifically, but did urge that the Commissioners obtain sufficient funds to permit the improvements she deems necessary for the County's schools. Miss Dent exhibited a map and graphic chart showing the location of present school buildings, and indicated approximate locations for consolidated schools, as well as replacements, because of inadequate facilities. She also informed the Board she will have complete details on this subject at an early date.


