Roads.

Mr. Jos. Hancock reported a bad condition in the road from Bishop's corner towards Craville, and from John Somerville's on Pincushion Road. Buses travel these roads. Mr. Thompson met Mr. Hancock in the hall and they conferred on the matter. Board also spoke with Mr. Thompson and instructed him to put gravel on the road as soon as possible.

Heat at Alms House

Smith's Inc, Leonardtown presented a contract which had been requested by the previous Board with reference to heat in the County Alms House. The contract is for \$3400.00, labor and material etc. Will try and have heat in building around New Year's.

Sheriff was handed a written order to have the John Norris family which has been in the Alms House for some days to leave. Girl and baby were sent there, as she represented she and baby had been set out of home by Shurf. After mother and child were told they could go to ALMS House for few days, husband appeared. He is capable of working, she is a half-wit and encourages husband to be lazy. He was put off the farm of L.R. Richardson and Clyde Abell as too lazy to work, wife's mother and brother both had the sheriff set them out when they were at those homes.

Road, McHay's Beach

All land for the road lies on the Blakeney's property and takes on the old road bed, la<sup>th</sup> is level. Check with Mr. Thompson and ascertain if road is necessary etc. Mr. Sterling, representing Mrs. Blakeney will see exactly how many families are on road. County willing to accept same if necessary.

Cedar Lane

L. Mattinly appeared requesting that road be gravelled is used by school buses and in bad condition. Matter referred to Mr. Thompson.

Planning Commission to submit recommendations they propose to County Commissioners before taking any action in the matter.

Bd. Education

Presented plans of shop & bldg in Charles Co. asks permission to use the \$2,000 allocated for emergency bldg and erect better bldg with shop at Banneker later. Situation cannot be relieved this year. Bd. feels present foundation could have been used and frame room erected for emergency use and they understood that room would later be used for a shop. However, since the Bd. of Educa. feels it better not to erect frame bldg on present foundation, but put that money towards a permanent shop the Co. Con. agreed, and the \$2,000.00 will now be used towards a permanent bldg.
