All members of the Board were present at the regular meeting today.

Ball Field

The Board unanimously agreed to lease a portion of the Alms House field, north field adjoining the County Fair Grounds, to a corporation of Businessmen of the County for use as a lighted ball field. The field will be available for other uses than baseball, such as parades, out-of-door contests or other entertainment. Grandstand will be erected. Detailed plans have not yet been completed or presented to the Board, the new organization has not entirely materialized, but when everything is in order a lease will be signed by the Board. It is anticipated the field will be ready for use this summer. Messrs. M.C. Thompson, Jr., and Barnard Smith represented the new organization.

Roads.

All road matters were referred to Mr. M.C. Thompson who was present.

Reduction in Personal Property Taxss

Atty W.A. Loker appeared with Dr. Walter Graham, Jr., Hollywood owner of the Froz en Food Lockers, relative to reduction in Personal Property tax assessment \$13,000- State Tax is over \$30,000.00 Dr. Graham requested that he be exempted from the personal property tax inasmuch as the equipment is used in processing stored foods. His real estate tax would not be affected. He feels that the plant is of great value to the county and he cannot stand the heavy taxes since he has had to pay so much in losses, when electricity is cut down without notice to him, he frequently has a burned out motor to replace etc. The matter will be considered by the Board, and a Resolution stating what help they can render Dr. Graham will be prepared by Mr. Briscoe. The Resolution will only affect Personal Property tax of Frozen Food Lockers in St. Mary's County.
