

February 27, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners met today in regular session. All members and their attorney, were present.

The usual routine of reading and approval of minutes was followed by signing and approval of salary and expense vouchers.

James Crosby, Ebenezer Church Road asked when repairs on that road could be expected. He said at present the road was dry and could be used, but after a heavy rain it would be impassible. R of W has been secured and recorded in Clerk's Office CBG #28 folio 405- Plat Book CBG #1-folio25. The Deed has not been sent to the Commissioners. Mr. Thompson said he would attend to the matter as soon as approval was received from the SRC.

Letter from Mr. Hiram Millison, Great Mills, accepting position on Planning Commission was received. Mr. T. Webster Bell has also agreed, verbally, to accept a position with this Commission.

Mr. Sol Russell complained about the water draining on the property of his son, Dr. Russell. He said Mr. W. Fish made the change in the road which changed the drainage. Mr. Thompson did not know when this was done. Mr. Thompson was informed of this and said he would see that change was made.

Mr. Sterling will write the Atty. Genl for an opinion as to when the salary of Mr. Frank Bailey, as County Treasurer is to begin. Mr. Bailey's bond has been accepted and his Commission is in the Clerk's office, but as yet he has not qualified.

Chas. Mattingly requested permission to employ two clerks to assist in getting out the 1951 Tax Bills. It takes about 6 weeks and will cost \$25 a week for each clerk. The Commissioners felt Mr. Bailey should pay $\frac{1}{2}$ and they would pay $\frac{1}{2}$ but took no action. They will decide later.

Out-patient service as explained by Mr. Fritz was not quite clear to the Commissioners. He said there was about \$1740 available for St. Mary's County, to the end of the fiscal year June 30- if the County put up that much. The Commissioners do not feel it will be necessary, but will talk to Dr. Houser at their next meeting. He has been requested to come in.

When in Annapolis the Commissioners, among other items, asked that the Bounty be returned for Foxes at \$2.00 each, and the Bounty for Hawks be increased from 25¢ to 50¢ each, effective immediately.

Mr. Sterling advised that under the new law for Baltimore County, all property of the Bd. of Education will be held in the name of the County in FEE Simple, and all new property acquired for schools will be vested in the County Commissioners. The Commissioners of St. Mary's County have asked that this law include St. Mary's County also.

License for farmers selling fertilizer, seeds, etc., was brought up at Annapolis and Sen. Bailey asked that Mr. Stone write him and give him details of the matter. Sen. Bailey feels these farmers should secure a license for this. Mr. Alvey advised that he was talking with Mr. Latham about the matter and the latter told him that since he had no stock he did not have to pay a license he was considered just an agent.

Mr. Elmer Stone came in to inform the Commissioners that a letter should be sent to Mr. Jos. M. Mattingly, Pres. County Soil Erosion Conservation District, asking for technical assistance on the Tall Timbers project. This was done.

Mr. Thompson informed that repairs on the road to the Godcharles' farm, where the school bus turns, had been made.

Mr. Sterling dictated a letter to Col. R.B. Duke, (with copies to be sent to Sen. Bailey and Rep. Fowler) stating the exact changes in dates of law referring to the County Levy. Phone call was made to Mr. Duke asking that this be made an Emergency measure so it would become effective at once.

Mr. Sterling was appointed to Welfare Bd. as attorney.

Mr. Frank Bailey came to ask for replacement of bounty on foxes. He was advised what the Commissioners had done.

Bd. made an appointment with Mr. Frederick Tilp, architect for new Health and County Bldg for Tues. March 13 at 10 a.m.

After inspecting the shelves being installed in the Law Library the Bd. adjourned at 3 p.m.

Planning Commission met in the Court Room with two new members Mr. Millison and Mr. Bell also present. At this meeting Mr. Sterling was appointed attorney at a salary of \$300 per annum. The subject considered was the one thousand unit housing development in the 8th District.
