Special meeting

This morning the audit of 1952, with the exception of the Sheriff's books, was handed to the Commissioners by Mr. David M. Gruber, CPA. Mr. Gruber explained several items in his report and talked at length about a Billing Machine, which can be rented for the purpose of preparing the Tax Bills rental for about 7 hours would do the work it requires clerks to do in about 6 - 7 weeks. Mr. Gruber spoke about a safe for the records which Mr. Wilkinson says he does not think necessary. Mr. Guy and Mr. Sterling are to go to Washington to see about a safe and will contact Mr. Gruber.

The audits are required by law to be published in the 2 County papers for 2 weeks, prior to the election in November. Mr. Gruber is sending this audit to the papers next week. He spoke about taxes on the 1,000 units which are built on land leased from the Government, but by private concerns. We cannot tax the land, but there is hope that we can get taxes from the improvements. He will also send Mr. Sterling information on this subject. If it is decided not to purchase a safe, he suggested that the present safes be checked for their fire resistance qualities.

Wilson Greenwell, asked permission to sell 2 coin operated machine licenses to Abe Weiner. This was not allowed. Letters to Mr. Greenwell advised him this cannot be done. Letter to Mr. Weiner advised him the decision of the Bd and also stated since he had been informed that licenses were due, he must secure them at once from the Clerk to the Court and pay the penalty.

Dr. Gamble came in to report that the bank fill on the Erosion Prevention project at Tall Timbers was sinking and that the Contractor, and Mr. Thompson, had informed him that before the job was completely finished this would be refilled.

New Health Center- Inspection by the US Public Health Service called for ceiling in basement storage area to be plastered. This was agreed upon by the Commissioners. Mr. Sutter, Mr. Tilp and the foreman advised of the agreement.
