

January 11, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session today. Due to annual bank meeting the attorney was not present.

Permission was given to Dep. Shrf. Harry S. Lancaster to proceed to Kentucky to obtain some of loot stolen in the robberies in Lexington Park area, from 6 filling stations and stores. Several youths and sailors have been apprehended in this matter. Mileage allowed for trip is 7¢ be ond County line, and meals and lodging is to be kept at a minimum.

American Janitor Supply Co gave a price on best paint  
2.60 per gal, inside flat this in connection with anticipated cleaning Alms House. Colors suggested #431 light green, 433, gray green #416 cream- for floors seal brown enamel #613- \$52.0 per gal lab-cote finish for floors \$5.20 per gal in lots of 55 gals.

Dr. Locke requested to visit and make report on Alms House.  
Commissioners to visit Alms House before next meeting  
Mrs. King to visit Alms House and make report.

Hollywood School- additional 4 rooms requested.  
Bd of Education-Mr. Johnson, Weiner, Mrs Gardiner, with Miss Reeder and Miss Dent had a conference with the County Commissioners concerning 4 rooms to be added to the Hollywood school. Furnace and sewage now installed adequate to take care of this. Architect estimates can be done for \$50,000.00. State survey shows Lex. Pk is 1st and Hollywood is 2nd fastest growing area in the County. Hollywood enrollment in Sept was 193, some children were sent to other schools-all with approval of parents who were very cooperative. Nov 30 found 139 children enrolled at Hollywood. A ditional class rooms are nee e thruout the County- Mech is equipp d for 250 pupils has 306; Leonardtwn equipped for 180 already has 173. Increase in pupil attendance this year was 44%, with 4,422 students enrolled. State anticipates between 55-60 the County will need 85 additional clas rooms. After a lengthy discussion the County Commissioners agreed to take the matter under consideration.

Extension of Bean's route.

Mr. Stone reported that Leo Bean would begin the morning extension of his route to pick up the Jarvoe children on Mulberry fields road. This will add 2 mi day his contract \$6 per mo. additional

Paul Bell to begin extension to Rosebank for Jimmie Haden, Green children 5 mi per day \$1.00 this will add \$14 per mo to his contract after Jan 31- for Jan he is allowed \$11.00

Copsey Bros plan a sub-division at River View, desire build proper road and turn same over to County; also willing to give acre of ground for Public Landing. Referred to Planning & Zon Comfor road builsing secifications etc., Location of property is Horse Landing Road.

Clarke's Dairy- Commissioners again asked Bd of Education to purchase all milk used in cafeterias of pub schools from Geo Clarke's dairy- Clarke's Dairy uses milk from county dairymen and employs county people, pays large taxes etc. Miss Dent advised that Pub sch cafeterias are self supporting and slection of milk etc left to principal of schools. Lex. park area uses Swal est milk as County agent has several children attending school. Miss Dent will again contact princpls of schools and advise Commissioners later.

Geo Quade- Commissioners requested State's Attorney to give an opinion on status of Geo Quade an inmate of Alms House, very undesirable as he does not comply with requests of Commissioners or Mrs. Ford about meals and remaining at Alms House.

Sheriff given permission to secure blackboard for his office.
