All members and their attorney were present today.

Mr. Ed Thompson, Hollywood Furniture Co., informed that where the non-resident traders only pay a \$15 annual license, all resident traders have to pay according to their inventory and asked if something could be done about it, since the traders at Charlotte Hall Market seemed to be the principal offenders and were causing all the merchants to lose money.
