Miss Dent called before the session opened to talk about Frank Knox school which she understands is to be operated by the US Navy as an intergrated school for the Navy personnel. If this is done over 200 children who attend that school will be displaced. Dr. Fullen has contacted the 2 US Representatives -and 1 Senator conc rning this matter. Miss Dent feels that if a member of the Bd. of County Commissioners accompanied by the Bd. of Education went to see the Representatives, they might be able to change this and let the school remain as it is under the jurisdiction of the Bd. of Educa. Mr. Alvey told her that if none of this Bd could go, there would be a letter for her to take when she goes. Letter was written and given to Miss Dent.

Mr. Stone, Mr. Alvey and Mr. Sterling were present today. Mr. Guy was absent attending opening of the Tobacco market.

Dr. Locke reported that Dr. Houser is back at work and will see the County Commissoners shortly.

Mr. Sterling contacted State Senator J.A. Mattingly requesting that he write the Gov and have Mary Agnes Buckler appointed Committing Magistrate-JP

Mrs. Leonard Copsey reported road at Horse Head in bad condition. Very narrow and dangerous in spots-should have rail guard 13 children living on the road attending school. Board agreed to have R of W looked up and to see Mr. Thompson about improving road.

Bus Inspector Dwyer of the Md. State Motor Veh Comm appeared and suggested that when the Public School Bus inspection is held late in August or early Sept, the Paro sch. busses be inspected at the same time. OK

Street signs for Lexington Park, as requested by the Postmaster there, should be supplied by the Chamber or Commerce. That town is not incorporated and therefore the County is not liable for these signs.

Mr. Fred Tilp, called to see about meeting of the Court House Bldg committee tentative date was set for May 18 at 7:30 pm Mr. Sterling will inform the committee members of this.

Col. Berger with Atty P.H. Dorsey called about the road into The Plains. Copy of the agreement signed by him and Mr. Alvey, is attached hereto.

8th District Delegation

Sheriff Miedzinski with merchants Jack Rue, Wm Chapman, Geo Aud, all of Lex.Pk Dep. Shrf H.S. Lancaster, and Delegates J. Frank Haley and Fran A. Combs and Editor Sheridan Fahenstock of The Enterprise, came about the full number of deputies the law will allow, and uniforms for them. The merchants have been paying \$350 per month, matched by the County, for the past several months for added police protection- they feel the County should provide enough deputies so they will not have to continue this payment. The sheriff had planned a schedule whereby with 5 deputies he could have a 24 hr. patrol every day- this would make the men work 60 hrs a week but he feels it would be advisable to do this At night there would always be 2 men working together as sometimes one man can be in a very dangerous spot when he attempts to control a fight. J. Frank Haley as well as the rest of the group felt that uniforms for the deputies would increase the respect shown them- that they could also be of assistance to strangers in directing them in the County; that there was great deal of vandalism in the public schools as well as robbery outside, feels the sheriff needs the 5 depu-

ties. All felt that uniforms were necessary and would increase the respect people had for the police. Many times there are 2 State Trooper at work and at the same time 2 on vacation, and days when inspections are held at Waldorf there are none in the County. Report from the Emergency Central Control was read, showing number of robberies, fights, accidents etc., reported thru them to the sheriff's office. Due to the absence of Mr. Guy no commitment was made as the Board will talk the matter over when he is present.

Letter addressed to Rep. R.D. Lankford, re Frank Knox School dictated by Mr. Sterling.
