

April 17, 1956

The Commissioners and their attorney were in general session today.

Dr. Houser and Dr. Locke came to inform that the Health Dept was holding two polio clinics. One on April 12, the other May 21. The 1st clinic will take care of 1,000 children between the ages of 1 and 20 years and will be held in the Leonardtown Pub school. The 2nd clinic will be in Banneker school. Since there are 13,200 children in the County between 1 and 20 yrs, not counting the military personnel, and serum is short, it will be 1st come 1st serve. Both newspapers and radio stations will advertise the clinics.

Trailer Laws. Charles and 3 other Counties have an Ordinance which allows the County Commissioners to charge a fee of \$500 per yr for parking of each trailer, plus \$50 to be paid in advance for each lot in the parking area. County Commissioners have the power to collect these fees and owner of parking lot collects from the trailers.

Parlett Gas Co representative called about the Grand Jury report that the jailor should have a new and adequate gas stove-range; 6 burner type believed to be best he was asked to send in a bid on the range. Letter to Bay Gas Co and Suburban Gas Co asking them to bid on the range by April 24.

Sheriff came in about Briscoe Barnes, colored man, always been odd, but now considered dangerous as he threatened someone with a gun. Man is in jail awaiting mental examination.

M.M. Dean contractor for new addition to and remodelling of Court House signed contract today.

Mosler Safe Co advised by letter the County accepts their bid on 2 doors 2 FS Mosler Vault Doors for \$1278.00 for new Court House.

Letter from Mr. Corby, state entomologist, about mosquito control. He was advised Commissioners desire an interview either in their office or wherever they select.

MEETING OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

Commissioners and their attorney with Dr. A.D. Houser and Dr. Robt. Locke met today as Board of Health, to consider conditions of sanitation in the County. Reports of existing conditions along G.M. road and at Great Mills state conditions very bad. The worst offender is Mr. Spencer of the Spencer Apts at G.Mills. The Board was asked to go to Great Mills with Dr. Houser and see the sewage seeping into the St. Mary's River. To have the necessary sanitation installed, the fairest solution would be to let the people who own property in that area form an Association and Sanitary District and have the matter taken care of, in that way only those affected by the improvements would have to pay the extra taxes. Jos. A. Mattingly is attorney for a group of residents in that area and he says that 90% of them are anxious to have the work done and to pay the extra taxes involved. Navy has agreed to allow the use of their disposal plant which would save a great deal of the cost of installing sewage etc. It is necessary for the County Commissioners to give their permission for the forming of a Sanitary District. Until the necessary sanitation is available there an injunction should be gotten out against Mr. Spencer by the Circuit Court, restraining him from using his property until the sanitation condition is improved as the place is not fit for human habitation. The State law requires that all sewage should be kept under cover and at no place should it enter a public water.

Attorney Jos A Mattingly is very ill, and as soon as he is able to handle the matter the County Commissioners will have a meeting with him and the Health officers (as the County Board of Health) and discuss what is best to be done.
