

August 7, 1956

Commissioners Alvey and Stone were present at today's regular meeting, with Attorney W.O.E. Sterling also here. Mr. Guy is on vacation.

Dr. A.D/Houser, Health Officer asked permission to assist county doctors in making examinations of insurance prospects, such examinations to be made after office hours and on Saturday. Permission was given.

Mrs. Hume Peabody and Mrs. Chas. Greenwell came about County Nursing Home. Dr. Houser advised expenses of building will be in 3 parts- 1/3 by Fed Govt 1/3 by State and 1/3 by County. Must be run on a non profit basis. Mrs. Hartwell would be interested in managing such a home. No decision

Ralph Blackistone, 7 Gables Hotel called about erosion along beach road. He said water has gone 6 inches under tarred road. First decision on this matter was made last year and wall was to be built in 3 sections, 1 each year until completed. Now the Board agrees with Mr. Thompson entire wall should be erected now. Mr. Thompson is having plans prepared and if money available will begin work at once. Work will be let on a bid.

Tall Timbers- J. Finnacom was back about road passing his home. 7 houses on this road. Mr. Thompson has inspected the road and thinks repairs etc necessary. DEED for R of W to be made to the Commissioners before anything can be done.

Mr. Wm. Bowman, County Surveyor asked what could be done about work for which his private clients have not paid him. This work is in connection with surveys where the County is concerned. It was decided that hereafter when a road is accepted for maintenance by the County property owners must pay all costs incidental to giving clear title. They must present evidence that all expenses- deed and survey etc., have been paid before the County will accept the road.

Wharf, St Geo Island work to be let on bid.

Letter from Paul E Schmid 8704 Reading Road, Silver Spring, asks when repairs will be made at Tall Timbers seawall. He was advised by letter this work is to be taken care of as soon as bids are received.

Arthur Rysticken appointed attorney to the Liquor Board at a salary of \$500 per yr was approved effective Aug 1, 1956

Hall of Records of Annapolis will send- at no cost to the County- a representative to check over all records in the Court House and determine which should be kept.

Mr. Harry Jones came in to request that when insurance on the Court House is given out that he receive part of same as he now has only a small amount on the Jail
