The Commissioners and their attorney were in general session today.

Delegations came in about transportation to parochial schools for colored children. They were reførred to Fr. Wilkinson SJ who has charge of this Mr. Alvey and Fr. Wilkinson, with Mrs. Welch as secretary, went into Room 5 to hear these requests since there was a group from the Public Tealth Dept also.

Nursing Home for the County.

Dr Houser with Mr. Fritz of the Fed Gealth Dept., Mrs Feabody, Mrs Chas Greenwell, Henry Fowler and Mr Fred Tilp conferred about a non-profit Nursing Home for this County. The State will furnish part of the cost, the Fed Govt will put up over 33-1/3% and the County will purchase the site and pay t he balance of the cost of construction. One register d nurse will be required (Mrs Hartwell will be considered for that position) the building should be equipped to care for over 40 patients with arrangements in enlarging this. In the opinion of Dr. Houser the population here is now over 40,000. The Nursing Home should contain rehabilitation center, chronic ward, alcoholic ward and treatment center. The site should include grounds for recreation and if possible overlock the water. Several doctors in the County, Bean, Fuchs, Guythern Greenwell, Houser have agreed to render their services free of charge. It is felt that such a home is vitally needed here. Commissioners will consult among themselves and decide later. If St. Mary's County has priority they may receive additional Fed, money. Mr. Fritz explained that all that is necessary now for the ed Govt to place this County on the list. is for a Reso lution from the Commissioners stating it is their intention to avail themselves of any federal grant, and of any State monies set aside for this project. No decision was made today. Servince for colored must alo be included.

Busses-Paul ^Bell was authorized to purchase a large bus in view of his increasing route and passengers. He will advise of his extensions later.

Mr G Alex Hebb came in about last year's unpaid balance. Used his car until his bus came, but was not paid. Board agreed to pay him in full for the 2 weeks in question. 182.66

Martha Jones of St. Joseph's parish and Alice Thomas of Holy Angels parish came in about transportation of colored children attending white schools. They were told by Mr Alvey that the Board of Education had complete control of the public school buses and the County Commissioners were making no provision for transporting colored children on the white buses this year. He suggested they take up the transportation problem with their pastors.

Henry Fowler would like to have his child attend Father Andrew White School. Mr. Alvey told him children should attend school nearest them if they wanted transportation on school bus. Suggested Mr. Fowler try to register his child at St. Joseph's School and then if he finds school too crowded to accept any more children, try to have child attend Father Andrew White School.

Mrs. Edenton from Lexington Park wanted transportation for her son from the Park to Leonard Hall School. Was told transportation had never been arranged for pupils to Leonard Hall.

Arthur Rysticken represented a delegation of parents from the Lexington Park area concerning transportation of children to St. Mary's Academy, Father Andrew White School, and Rycken High School. Mr. Rysticken said parents feel another bus is needed in that area, since there are enough children in Town Creek alone to fill one bus. Paul Bell, the contractor for that area, is agreeable to purchasing another bus if the County Commissioners approve. Mr. Alvey will consult with other Commissioners and let Mr. Bell know about this. Also will advise Mr. Rysticken if another bus will be available for Lexington Park area.
