## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, by Resolution duly passed by the County Commissioners of Saint Mary's County, Maryland, on December 16th, 1947, it was provided, among other things, that in Saint Mary's County, Maryland, all coin operated machines with revolving wheels or cylinders and commonly known as slot machines, or console machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all machines known as race horse machines and pin ball machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all claws machines or similar devices, (music boxes and bona fide vending machines excepted), shall be subject to a gross receipts tax of Five (5%) per centum to be collected by the Comptroller of the State of Maryland, under the provisions of Chapter 601 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1947, and, WHEREAS, the County Commissioners of Saint Mary's County, Maryland, desire to amend the aforesaid Resolution to provide that all said machines shall be subject to a gross receipts tax of Ten (10%) Per Centum in lieu of a gross receipts tax of Five (5%) Per Centum.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the County Commissioners of Saint Mary's County, Maryland, in regular meeting assembled on the 7th day of May, 1957, that in Saint Mary's County, Maryland, all coin operated machines with revolving wheels or cylinders and commonly known as Slot Machines, or Console Machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all machines known as race horse machines and pin ball machines, whether discharging coins or not, and all claw machines or similar devices, (music boxes and bona fide vending machines excepted), shall be subject to a gross receipts tax of Ten((10%) Per Centum to be collected by the Comptroller of the State of Maryland, under the provisions of Chapter 601 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1947.
