Chas. Wood reported that SRC had done nothing about an entrance to his property

Oliver Guyther was requested by letter to meet with the Board on April 5 in the morning.

Robt. Dean-Hollywood presented a Proclamation prepared by the Lions'-District 22-C setting April as National Tafety Month-he asked that this be approved by the Board, and 2 copies sent to him and 3 sent- 1 to each of the County papers. This was done and 1 copy is filed here.

SRC- JD Bond and Jr. "eley came in regarding the sections of 2 abandoned roads on the Giddings sub-division." The Commissioners agreed to notifying the publi that these sections would be abandoned, by proper notices in the County papers

Jr. Raley advised that he will secure a Right of Way from Mrs. "aude Gardiner on the Chaptico-"ech road. General road matters were then discussed.

SRC advised by letter with plats attached that the following roads had been accepted:-

Bensonwood CBG 77 folio 303 this was accepted some time ago

Clerk requested to order 25 NO DUMPING signs from State Use Industries

Admr. Johnson, Col Simpson and Warren Guy came to hear the proposed Budget the first two were interested primarily in the Library, and after discussing the matter the Commissioners agreed to allot a flat sum of \$14,000 for the library for 60-61 Warren Guy talked about the budget in general and made several very good suggestions- one to change law regarding Dog licenses, increase license of female dogs- another to increase the sheriff fees, as well as salaries and expenses of sheriff and deputies. Bem Burroughs came in to explain why the Shrf had requested an increase in expense accounts. Nothing can be done about these until law is changed.

After a full consideration of all items on the 1960-61 Budget the County Sommissioners set the following tax rates Real Estate \$1.80 on the \$100.00 8th Dist Fire Tax .10 on the \$100

Sitting as District Council for the Tall Timbers on the Potomac Erosion Frevention Froject the Commissioners set the tax rate for maintenance of seawall at \$2.50 the \$100 same as heretofore.
