

January 17, 1961

All officials present at this meeting.

Dr. Houser presented a Health Dept budget for 1961-62.

He wanted to encourage the Commissioners to be in favor of a Nursing Home Bill-  
This would probably be connected with the St. Mary's Hospital, for use of  
snack bar, etc., but in no way operated by the hospital.  
He asked that his expenses of \$125.00 per month be labelled "salary" and  
that he be given an additional \$50 per month for expenses. No decision.

Mr. Binnsfield, Chief of the Div. of Food Control of Md., had written Geo.  
Clarke, proprietor of the Leonardtown Dairy, that his license would be revoked  
due to the label on his milk cartons. This was discussed with Dr. Houser.

Mr. Robert E. King, Jr and Mr. Harry Ocker of the Bd. of Education came to  
request the Commissioners to sign a request for \$250,000.00 of the State School  
Loan of 1956, to which the Commissioners are still entitled. No special proj-  
ect was named for which the money will be used. The three Commissioners  
signed the request and Mr. King was so advised.

Mr. J. Julius Johnson, County Agent came in with Dr. Foster and Mr. Wm. Smith  
of the Div. of Mosquito Control, Md. Univ. They discussed the possibility  
of the County assuming full control of the Mosquito Control project. The  
State is still willing to continue the present arrangement, but due to the  
excessive travelling expenses incident to this work, it might be cheaper if  
the County had their own laborers. This year it will be necessary to employ  
4 men and 2 trucks. Mr. Bill Rigby who was in charge of this operation in  
the County last year will be back but will need 3 more men. Rigby could  
be County Superintendent, with Smith Supt for the State. No decision.

SRC Jr. Raley and Mr. Capps of Town Creek Manor came in. Mr. Capps asked  
the Commissioners to take over Sherman Street in Town Creek Manor. Jr. Raley  
and Commissioner Hodges will meet Mr. Capps at 8:30 am Thurs. regarding the  
above.

Letter from M.W. Townsend, Avenue, Md. complaining of conditions of Public Dump  
used by people of the 7th District -he was advised SRC will take care of this  
matter.

"Weight Limit" signs will be placed on several County roads to prevent large  
trucks from using and breaking them.

J. Frank Raley, Jr., Co-Chairman of the Study Committee came in. He informed  
the Commissioners he would try and have a complete report ready for them some-  
time during the week of the 22nd. Later there could be a meeting between  
the Commissioners and several members of the Study Committee and the St. Mary's Co  
Delegates regarding the reports and recommendations.
