

October 5, 1961

Rep. Richard E. Lankford made his annual visit here to meet his constituents and the Commissioners.

The three Commissioners were here and talked over the matter of the US Navy Surplus property at "ex. Pk., Md. Rep. Lankford was shown the correspondence on this project and brought up to date on the subject.

Also present were Mr. King, Bd. of Education; Mrs. Daugherty and Messrs Hall and Fahenstock, County library. Dr. Houser- for the Health Dept., was unable to attend. Mr. King advised Rep. Lankford that the Bd. of Educa felt their request was ok.

When the Commissioners informed Rep. Lankford that they were making application for the Community Bldg, to be used by the Health Dept and County Library and the Child Care Bldg and land in that tract, he suggested that plans include some space for the Administrative offices of the Bd. of Educa. Mr. King said he thought the Bd. of Educa Transportation and Maintenance Depts would need rooms. This being agreeable, the Commissioners then decided they would apply for the Community Bldg to be used by the Health Dept and Bd. of Educa and the Child Care Bldg for the library; also they would apply for the remainder of the tract to be used as a parking lot for these 3 Depts.

Mr. Tilp is to be advised of this change in plans.

When discussing the matter of the Fire House, they were advised the GSA will sell this at a fair market value. Rep. Lankford thinks that in Jan. session of the U S Congress he can introduce a bill to have the ground turned over to the Fire Dept. He will discuss this with Mr. Moore, Administrator GSA and try to work out something.

Commissioners will call Mr. Tilp, ask that he meet with Bd. of Educa, Library and Health Dept October 10 for general discussion on the above; and at 2:30 pm meet with the Bd.

The Commissioners adjourned at noon.
