# **A. OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY** - Legislative Proposals - Presentation

**Present:** David Weiskopf, County Attorney

Ten legislative proposals were presented to the Commissioners for their review and consideration.

1. To request to amend Chapter 49-1B(2)(C) of *Article 19 of the Public Local Laws of St. Mary's County* – to amend the Emergency Services Support Tax per \$100 of assessable real

property to be determined by the Commissioners of St. Mary's County. (requested by Commissioner John O'Connor).

- 2. To request to amend §13-402(c)(12) and §21-104.5 of the *Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to authorize the Commissioners of St. Mary's County to designate on which county highways a person may operate a golf cart in St. Mary's County and to exempt Golf Carts from Motor Vehicle Registration Requirements in St. Mary's County under certain circumstances (requested by Commissioners Eric Colvin and John O'Connor)
- 3. To amend §29-106(b)(1) and (2) of the *Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to revise the St. Mary's County Human Relations Commission "Duties" language. (requested by Lori Jennings-Harris, Director of Dept. of Aging and Human Services in conjunction with the Human Relations Commission).
- 4. To request to amend §20-405 of the *Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to increase the St. Mary's County Public Accommodations Tax cap (requested by Commissioner President Randy Guy).
- 5. To request to amend §10-402(C)(11) of the *Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to allow St. Mary's County Animal Control Officers to wear body cameras (requested by Stephen Walker, Director of Dept. of Emergency Services).

To request to amend §3-702(b) of the *Labor and Employment Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to exclude St. Mary's County Government paramedic and EMT applicants and St. Mary's County Government Emergency Communications Center applicants from prohibition of polygraph examinations. To request to amend §14-813(e)(2) of the Tax *Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to amend the allowable expenses for auctioneer fees to be the "actual cost" charged by the auctioneer for each property sold at tax sale in St. Mary's County. (requested by Christine L. Kelly, Treasurer)
- 8. To request to amend §1-113 of *the General Provisions Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to amend the definition of "newspaper" and "newspaper in general circulation." (requested by David Weiskopf, County Attorney).
- 9. To request to add *Local Government Article 12 Subtitle 10 of the Annotated Code of Maryland* to include Motor Vehicle Towing and Immobilization on Private Property in St. Mary's County (requested by Commissioner John O'Connor).
